MATCH TRANSFER. DIRECTOR'S OFFICE/OFFICE OF CHIEF COUNSEL. Upon approval 20 21 by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, the Chief Counsel for the 22 Department of Human Services may transfer an amount up to but not to exceed 23 \$12,000 for the 1995-97 biennial period and deposit same in a bank account 24 for the purpose of purchasing evidence in the course of investigating the 25 illegal use of food stamps and compliance activities for the WIC Program. 26 The funds so transferred shall be subject to accounting in a manner 27 substantially similar to that employed by the Arkansas State Police for such 28 transactions; provided however, that information tending to identify 29 participants in such transactions shall be exempt from the Arkansas Freedom 30 of Information Act. 31 SECTION 64. ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES - CLIENT SPECIFIC EMERGENCY 32 33 SERVICES REVOLVING CASH FUND PAYING ACCOUNT. The Department of Human 34 Services - Division of Administrative Services is hereby authorized to 35 establish and maintain as a cash fund account the Client Specific Emergency

1 Services Revolving Fund Paying Account consisting of Federal grants, aids, 2 cash donations, reimbursements and State general revenue, not to exceed a 3 daily balance of \$10,000.00, for delivery of immediate care, short-term or 4 emergency services to eligible clients. Said account shall be established 5 and maintained in accordance with procedures established by the Chief Fiscal 6 Officer for cash funds and shall be administered under the direction of the 7 Director of the Department of Human Services. R 9 SECTION 65. AGING AND ADULT SERVICES. The Director of the Department 10 of Human Services is authorized to use State funds appropriated in this Act 11 to match Federal funds available under Title III and Title V of the Older 12 Americans Act, Social Services Block Grant, or such other federal funds as 13 may become available. 14 15 SECTION 66. AGING AND ADULT SERVICES. All appropriations for state 16 and federal funding contained herein for the Division of Aging and Adult Services and that are distributed under grant or contract methodologies may 18 be disbursed by the Department of Human Services in the same manner as 19 authorized under federal regulations for the disbursement of Title III Older 20 Americans Act funds. Otherwise, all disbursements shall comply with the 21 provisions of this Act. 22 SECTION 67. AGING AND ADULT SERVICES. Funding for "Nursing Home Care 2.3 24 Alternatives", as it appears in SECTION 26, Item (08) may be used for home 25 delivered meals, adult day care, homemaker/chore, respite care, personal 26 care, health promotion, and other community based activities. These funds 27 may also be used to match Medicaid community based programs. 28 SECTION 68. STATE SERVICES FOR THE BLIND - SUPPLEMENTAL INSURANCE. 29 30 Staff members who transport blind and visually impaired persons on official 31 state business of the Division of State Services for the Blind are entitled 32 to reimbursement for supplemental insurance costs. Costs incurred for 33 supplemental liability automobile insurance above the minimum required by law 34 for the purpose of including coverage for work related activities shall be

DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES - VOCATIONAL TRAINEES. 12 The 13 Division of Developmental Disabilities Services of the Department of Human 14 Services is hereby authorized for the 1995-97 biennium to provide employment opportunities for people with developmental disabilities residing at the Human Development Centers who work less than a competitive employment level separate from the currently authorized regular Vocational Trainee positions. The positions authorized herein shall not be incorporated into the present 18 19 classification system but shall be provided for by each Human Development 20 Center on a Cash Account basis. It is the intent of the General Assembly 21 that the authorization of these positions shall facilitate the agency's ability to provide for residents with lower work productivity. 23 SECTION 72. DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES - TRANSFER OF FUNDS. 2.4 25 Director of the Department of Human Services is hereby authorized, with the approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, and after having sought a prior review by the Arkansas Legislative Council, to transfer any line item appropriation made to Developmental Disabilities Services to any other line item appropriation authorized herein to Developmental Disabilities Services with one exception: Item (01) of Section 41 herein, the same being Grants to 31 Community Providers may not be decreased. 32 SECTION 73. 12 SECTION 81. MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES - ALLOCATION RESTRICTION AND

13 TRANSFER PROVISION. Of the amounts allocated in Section 80 hereof, it is the

14 intent of the General Assembly that such amounts are to be the maximum

15 expended in the applicable fiscal year from the funds as appropriated in

16 Section 53 hereof for the benefit of the appropriate program so enumerated.
