HOUSE BILL 1977

For An Act To Be Entitled

"AN ACT TO AMEND ARKANSAS CODE 12-12-202 TO DEFINE THE
MEMBERSHIP OF THE SUPERVISORY BOARD OF THE ARKANSAS CRIME
INFORMATION CENTER; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. Arkansas Code 12-12-202 is amended to read as follows:

"§ 12-12-202. Supervisory board - Members - Meetings.

(a) There is created a Supervisory Board for the Arkansas Crime
Information Center.

(b) The supervisory board shall consist of fourteen (14) members:

(1) The Attorney General or one (1) of his assistants;

(2) The Chief Justice of the Supreme Court or his designated

agent;

(3) A member designated by the Arkansas Association of

Prosecuting Attorneys;

(4) A member designated by the Arkansas Sheriffs Association;

(5) A member designated by the Arkansas Association of Municipal

Judges;

(6) A member designated by the President of the Arkansas Bar

Association who is regularly engaged in criminal defense work;

(7) A citizen of the State of Arkansas to be appointed by the

3 (9) A member designated by the Arkansas Municipal Police

5 (10) The Director of the Department of Correction or his
6 designated agent;

7 (11) A member designated by the Arkansas Association of Chiefs
8 of Police;

9 (12) A member designated by the Association of Arkansas
10 Counties; (13) The Director of the Department of Arkansas
11 State *Police* or his designated agent;

12 (14) The Governor or a member of his staff designated by him.

13 (c) No member shall continue to serve on the supervisory board when
14 the member no longer officially represents the function for which the member
15 was appointed, except the citizen appointed by the Governor, who shall serve
16 for a period of four (4) years.

17 (d) The board, for cause, may remove any board member and shall notify
18 the Governor of the removal and reason therefor.

19 (e) The board may, by vote of the total membership of the board cast
20 at its first regularly scheduled meeting of each calendar year, authorize
21 expense reimbursement for board members, other than legislators, performing
22 official board duties. The expense reimbursement shall not exceed the rate
23 established for state employees by state travel regulations. Legislator
24 members shall receive per diem, mileage and expense reimbursement at the same
25 rate as that prescribed for legislators for attending meetings of joint
26 interim committees of the General Assembly. The board may, by a majority
27 vote of the total membership of the board cast during its first regularly
28 scheduled meeting of each calendar year, authorize payment of a stipend to
29 its members who are not legislators. The stipend shall not exceed seventy-
30 five dollars (\$75.00) per meeting attended, and the board members shall
31 receive no other compensation, expense *reimbursement*, or in lieu payments
32 *except* as provided in this subsection.

33 (f) The supervisory board shall meet at such times and places as it
34 shall deem appropriate. A majority of the board shall constitute a quorum for
35 transacting any business of the board."

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SECTION 2. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

SECTION 3. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this act are declared to be severable.

SECTION 4. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are hereby repealed.
