9 DEMONSTRATION PROJECT; TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY; AND FOR

16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

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18 SECTION 1. Title. This act shall be known as and may be cited as the
19 "Arkansas Distance Learning Demonstration Project Act of 1995."

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21 SECTION 2. Purpose. The purpose of this act is to serve as a
22 legislative mandate for the establishment, organization, and administration
23 of a demonstration project designed to improve course offerings available to
24 high school students throughout the state. The project will demonstrate the
25 efficiency of using distance learning to enhance education and prepare
26 students for greater success in a postsecondary educational environment.

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28 SECTION 3. Definitions. As used in this act, unless the context
29 otherwise requires:

30 (1) "OURNET" means the Ozark Unlimited Resources Educational
31 Cooperative Network.

(2) "Board" means the State Board of Education.

33 (3) "Distance learning" means an interactive telecommunications system
34 that utilizes information technology, audio, video, and similar technological
35 elements, is compatible with other distance learning networks, and is used

1 for the purpose of enhancing instructional opportunities in Arkansas public
2 schools.

3 (4) "Department" means the Arkansas Department of Education, General
4 Education Division.

5 (5) "Director" means the Director of the General Education Division of
6 the Arkansas Department of Education.

7 (6) "Infrastructure" means an interlinked system of wires, cables,
8 fiber optics, or other wireline or wireless communications media.

9 (7) "Project" means the Arkansas Distance Learning Demonstration
10 Project.

11 (8) "Public telecommunications" means the facilities used in providing
12 telecommunication services to the public including, but not limited to,
13 facilities owned and operated by public utilities.

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15 SECTION 4. (a) There is hereby established the Arkansas Distance
16 Learning Demonstration Project, which shall be conducted by OURNET and
17 administered through the Director of the General Education of the Arkansas
18 Department of Education.

19 (b)(1) The Director shall review the implementation of this project
20 annually and make recommendations to the Board regarding the number and
21 amount of awards to ensure that the purpose of the project is realized.

22 (2) The Board is authorized to promulgate rules and regulations
23 necessary for the implementation of this act.

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25 SECTION 5. The funding necessary to carry out the provisions of this
26 act may be derived from donations, grants, or legislative appropriation. The
27 Director may solicit and receive donations and grants for the purpose of
28 administering the project. All donations, grants, and appropriations
29 received shall be accounted for by the Department.

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31 SECTION 6. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent
32 nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas
33 Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

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35 SECTION 7. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to

1 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect
2 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without
3 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
4 act are declared to be severable.

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6 SECTION 8. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are
7 hereby repealed.

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9 SECTION 9. EMERGENCY. It is hereby found and determined by the
10 General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the effectiveness of this act
11 on July 1,. 1995, is essential to the successful establishment of a distance
12 learning demonstration project in Arkansas high schools during the 1995-96
13 school year and to the planning and efficiency of the state agencies and
14 local school districts involved in the project. Therefore, an emergency is
15 hereby declared to exist and this act being necessary for the immediate
16 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety, shall be in full force
17 and effect from and after July 1, 1995.
