14 ENDORSING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF INTERSTATE 69 LINKING
15 CANADA AND MEXICO VIA THE CENTRAL UNITED STATES AND URGING
16 THAT THE HIGHWAY TRAVERSE ARKANSAS.

18 WHEREAS, Corridor 18, also known as Interstate 69, would provide a link
19 from the Canadian border to the Mexican border via the Central United States,
20 and

21 WHEREAS, the route has been fixed by Congress to connect Indianapolis,
22 Indiana, and Houston, Texas, with intermediary points of Memphis, Tennessee,
23 and Shreveport-Bossier City, Louisiana, and

24 WHEREAS, this proposed major new highway offers an opportunity to
25 benefit Arkansas by providing improved access to markets of Canada and
26 Mexico, and

27 WHEREAS, proposed Corridor 18 would provide economic stimulus to
28 benefit depressed areas of Arkansas and make these more competitive for
29 industrial purposes, and

30 WHEREAS, the Arkansas Highway and Transportation Department has been
31 designated lead agency in the efforts to establish this corridor,
