### Subtitle

14 COMMENDING THE CAMDEN MUNICIPAL COURT FOR INNOVATIVE AND  
15 SUCCESSFUL EFFORTS IN REDUCING THE RECIDIVISM RATE FOR  
16 SHOPLIFTING.

18 WHEREAS, the Camden Municipal Court has received national media  
19 attention for its innovative and successful efforts during the past ten (10)  
20 years to reduce the recidivism rate for shoplifting; and

22 WHEREAS, the Camden Municipal Court imposes a fine, a sixty (60) day  
23 jail sentence, and one (1) year probation on first offender shoplifters; and

25 WHEREAS, the jail sentence is suspended on condition that the defendant  
26 commits no further shoplifting offenses for one (1) year and completes five  
27 (5) hours of rehabilitative service; and

29 WHEREAS, the rehabilitative service consists of the defendant returning  
30 to the store where the offense occurred and walking in a designated area  
31 wearing a sign that states "I was convicted of shoplifting and this is part  
32 of my sentence"; and

34 WHEREAS, most defendants elect to complete the five (5) hours of  
35 rehabilitative service and there have been very few repeat offenders.
