19 active military bases to be closed; and

25 for a facility that meets special training needs; and

27 WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of America to keep a qualified,  
28 highly trained, technologically superior armed force for future agressions  
29 against our country; and

31 WHEREAS, Arkansas has already suffered its share of the base closure  
32 burden as a result of the closure of Eakers Air Force Base in Blytheville,  
33 Arkansas; and

35 WHEREAS, Arkansas is proud of its heritage as the host of military

1 facilities which have proven beneficial to our national interest both during  
2 war and during peace.

4 NOW THEREFORE,

5 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE EIGHTIETH GENERAL  
6 ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

8       That Arkansas\_ Congressional Delegation is hereby requested to exert  
9 its full power to assure that Fort Chaffee remain an active military base.
