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### For An Act To Be Entitled

8 "AN ACT TO MAKE AN APPROPRIATION FOR OPERATING EXPENSES  
9 FOR THE PETIT JEAN TECHNICAL COLLEGE WHICH SHALL BE  
10 SUPPLEMENTAL AND IN ADDITION TO THOSE FUNDS APPROPRIATED  
11 BY ACT 661 OF 1993; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

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### Subtitle

14 "AN ACT FOR THE PETIT JEAN TECHNICAL  
15 COLLEGE SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION."

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17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

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19 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATIONS. There is hereby appropriated, to the Petit  
20 Jean Technical College, to be payable from the Petit Jean Technical College  
21 Fund, for operating expenses of the Petit Jean Technical College which shall  
22 be supplemental and in addition to those funds appropriated in Section 3 of  
23 Act 661 of 1993, the following:

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1 SECTION 2. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds  
2 authorized by this Act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency  
3 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and  
4 the restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and  
5 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary  
6 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditure  
7 Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this  
8 State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of  
9 Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied  
10 with in disbursement of said funds.

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12 SECTION 3. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General  
13 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations  
14 contained in this Act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for  
15 which this Act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive  
16 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget  
17 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or  
18 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative  
19 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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21 SECTION 4. CODE. All provisions of this Act of a general and  
22 permanent nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and  
23 the Arkansas Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

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25 SECTION 5. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this Act or the  
26 application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such  
27 invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Act which  
28 can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this  
29 end the provisions of this Act are declared to be severable.

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31 SECTION 6. GENERAL REPEALER. All laws and parts of laws in conflict  
32 with this Act are hereby repealed.

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34 SECTION 7. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the  
35 Eightieth General Assembly that funds provided by the General Assembly for the

1 operations of the Petit Jean Technical College are, due to unforeseen  
2 circumstances, insufficient for the Petit Jean Technical College to continue  
3 to provide essential governmental services; that the provisions of this act  
4 will provide the necessary monies for the Petit Jean Technical College to  
5 continue such services; and that a delay in the effective date of this Act  
6 could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of  
7 essential governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared  
8 to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the  
9 public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and  
10 after the date of its passage and approval.

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
