8 "AN ACT TO MAKE AN APPROPRIATION FOR OPERATING EXPENSES
9 FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF PARKS AND TOURISM WHICH SHALL BE
10 SUPPLEMENTAL AND IN ADDITION TO THOSE FUNDS APPROPRIATED
11 BY ACT 728 OF 1993; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

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Subtitle

14 "AN ACT FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF PARKS AND
15 TOURISM SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION."

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17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

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19 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATIONS. There is hereby appropriated, to the
20 Department of Parks and Tourism, to be payable from the Department of Parks
21 and Tourism Fund Account, for operating expenses of the Department of Parks
22 and Tourism which shall be supplemental and in addition to those funds
23 appropriated in Section 3 of Act 728 of 1993, the following:

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1 SECTION 2. FUNDING TRANSFER. Immediately upon the effective date of
2 this Act, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall transfer on his books
3 and those of the State Treasurer the sum of six hundred twenty five thousand
4 one hundred six dollars (\$625,106) from the General Revenue Allotment Reserve
5 Fund to the Department of Parks and Tourism Fund Account to provide funds for
6 the appropriation provided herein.

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8 SECTION 3. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds
9 authorized by this Act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
10 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
11 the restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and
12 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
13 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
14 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
15 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
16 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

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18 SECTION 4. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
19 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
20 contained in this Act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for
21 which this Act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
22 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
23 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
24 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
25 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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27 SECTION 5. CODE. All provisions of this Act of a general and
28 permanent nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and
29 the Arkansas Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

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31 SECTION 6. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this Act or the
32 application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such
33 invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Act which
34 can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this
35 end the provisions of this Act are declared to be severable.

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SECTION 7. GENERAL REPEALER. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are hereby repealed.

SECTION 8. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the Eightieth General Assembly that funds provided by the General Assembly for the operations of the Department of Parks and Tourism are, due to unforeseen circumstances, insufficient for the Department of Parks and Tourism to continue to provide essential governmental services; that the provisions of this act will provide the necessary monies for the Department of Parks and Tourism to continue such services; and that a delay in the effective date of this Act could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval.

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
