# A Bill

SENATE BILL 437

## For An Act To Be Entitled

"AN ACT AMENDING ARK. CODE ANN. § 6-17-808(d) TO REQUIRE THAT SCHOOL DISTRICTS SHALL FILE WRITTEN SALARY SCHEDULES FOR CLASSIFIED PERSONNEL WITH THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION NO LATER THAN THIRTY (30) DAYS BEFORE THE FIRST SCHEDULED PAYMENT OF THE FISCAL YEAR; TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

## Subtitle

"TO REQUIRE SCHOOL DISTRICTS TO FILE WRITTEN SALARY SCHEDULES FOR CLASSIFIED PERSONNEL NO LATER THAN 30 DAYS BEFORE THE FIRST SCHEDULED PAYMENT OF THE FISCAL YEAR."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. Ark. Code Ann. § 6-17-808(d) is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(d)(1) The school districts of this state shall adopt written salary schedules for classified personnel annually and shall file such schedules with the State Department of Education no later than thirty (30) days before the first scheduled payment of the fiscal year.

(2) Such schedules shall reflect the actual pay practices of the district for classified personnel."

SECTION 2. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

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SECTION 3. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this act are declared to be severable.

SECTION 4. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5. Emergency. It is hereby found and determined by the General Assembly that the effectiveness of this act on July 1, 1995 is essential to the operation of the Department of Education and all school districts in this state and that in the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective date of this act beyond July 1, 1995, could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration of the Department and all school districts in this state. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 1995.

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
