# A Bill

SENATE BILL 62

## For An Act To Be Entitled

"AN ACT TO DEFINE THE BUSINESS OF HOME INSPECTION; TO  
PRESCRIBE THAT HOME INSPECTIONS SHALL BE DONE IN  
COMPLIANCE WITH CERTAIN STANDARDS OF PRACTICE; TO DECLARE  
AN EMERGENCY; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

## Subtitle

"TO PRESCRIBE THAT THE BUSINESS OF HOME  
INSPECTIONS SHALL BE DONE IN COMPLIANCE  
WITH CERTAIN STANDARDS OF PRACTICE."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. As used in this act, unless the context otherwise requires:

(1) "Home inspector" or "inspector" means any person or entity, who examines for a fee, any component of a dwelling, through visual means and through normal user controls, without the use of mathematical or engineering services. The term "home inspector" shall not include licensed tradespeople performing maintenance, repair or installation work, individuals acting in the capacity of governmental employee or governmental agent, or licensed professional architects or engineers.

(2) "Client" means any person who hires a home inspector for a fee.

(3) "Home inspection" or "inspection" means an inspection done on residential property of not more than four (4) dwelling units per building, including ancillary buildings as defined in the current Standards of Practice of the American Society of Home Inspectors.

SECTION 2. A home inspector who provides a home inspection for a client shall do so in accordance with the Standards of Practice of the

1 American Society of Home Inspectors, in accordance with the Arkansas  
2 Association of Real Estate Inspectors, and in accordance with the Code of  
3 Ethics of the Arkansas Association of Real Estate Inspectors.

5 SECTION 3. All provisions of this act of general and permanent nature  
6 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code  
7 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

9 SECTION 4. If any provisions of this act or the application thereof to  
10 any person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity shall not affect  
11 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without  
12 the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of this  
13 act are declared to be severable.

15 SECTION 5. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are  
16 hereby repealed.

18 SECTION 6. Emergency. It is hereby found and determined by the  
19 Eightieth General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that real estate and home  
20 inspections in Arkansas are currently being done by individuals without any  
21 standards of practice regarding the actual inspections and without any  
22 ethical duty to their clients; that home inspectors are accepting and  
23 charging their clients significant fees for services without any real  
24 standard; and that it is necessary for the State of Arkansas to set some  
25 standard of practice for real estate and home inspections to protect the  
26 Arkansas consumer from possibly unscrupulous people. Therefore, in order to  
27 protect the consumers of Arkansas, an emergency is hereby declared to exist,  
28 and this act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public  
29 peace, health, and safety, shall be in full force and effect from and after  
30 its passage and approval.
