14 PROPOSING A CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT CONCERNING THE TERMS  
15 OF OFFICE OF GOVERNOR AND ATTORNEY GENERAL.

18 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE EIGHTIETH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE  
19 OF ARKANSAS AND BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, A MAJORITY OF ALL MEMBERS  
20 ELECTED TO EACH HOUSE AGREEING THERETO:

22 That the following is hereby proposed as an amendment to the  
23 Constitution of the state of Arkansas, and upon being submitted to the  
24 electors of the state for approval or rejection at the next general election  
25 for Senators and Representatives, if a majority of the electors voting  
26 thereon at such election, adopt such amendment, the same shall become a part  
27 of the Constitution of the state of Arkansas, to wit:

29 SECTION 1. (a) The Governor and Attorney General shall hold their  
30 offices for a term of two (2) years.

31 (b)(1) No person shall hold the office of Governor for more than four  
32 (4), two-year terms.

33 (2) No person shall hold the office of Attorney General for more  
34 than four (4), two-year terms.

1 SECTION 2. (a) Nothing in this Amendment shall reduce the term of  
2 office for which the Governor or Attorney General is serving on the effective  
3 date of this Amendment.

4 (b) This Amendment shall apply to service beginning on or after  
5 January 1, 1995 and a Governor or Attorney General having served a four (4)  
6 year term shall be considered as having served two (2), two-year terms.
