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28	SECTION 1. Arkans	sas Code Annotated $^{\circ}$ 6-16-703 is amended t	o read as	
29	follows:			
30	"6-16-703. Legisla	ative findings - Mandatory summer school -	- Rules an	.d

32	(a)(1) The Genera	al Assembly hereby finds and acknowledges	that if	
33	remediation is necessary	, it should be provided when students are	younger	and
34	before patterns of failure are established. The General Assembly further			
35	acknowledges that the expansion of summer remedial instruction programs during			
36	the summers of 1995 and 1996 did not generally prove to be as educationally			

- 1 advantageous and as cost effective as anticipated, that the people of Arkansas
- 2 would be better served if the State acted to ensure that all public school
- 3 students were able to read at or above grade level upon exiting grade three
- 4 (3), that local school districts are in the best position to determine if
- 5 remediation is necessary for students in grades four (4) and five (5), and
- 6 that the districts should have the option of providing summer school for such
- 7 students and requiring attendance thereto to be eligible for promotion to the
- 8 next grade.
- 9 (2) The General Assembly further finds that not all students are
- 10 financially able to pay for summer school, nor do all school districts hold
- 11 summer school. It is therefore the purpose of this section to allow the
- 12 public school districts of Arkansas to either individually or cooperatively
- 13 provide free summer school and summer school transportation to those students
- 14 in kindergarten through grade three (K-3) who did not perform at grade level
- 15 during the regular school year and to ensure that students in kindergarten
- 16 through grade three (3) who are identified as in danger of not being able to
- 17 read at grade level by the end of the school year receive intensive reading
- 18 instruction during their regularly scheduled reading time throughout the
- 19 regular school year.
- 20 (3) It is further the purpose of this section to allow the public
- 21 school districts of Arkansas to either individually or cooperatively provide
- 22 free summer school and summer school transportation to students in grades four
- 23 (4) and five (5) who did not perform at grade level during the regular school
- 24 year.
- 25 (b)(1) Each student in kindergarten through grade three (K-3) who did
- 26 not perform at grade level during the regular school year shall attend summer
- 27 school to be eliqible for promotion to the next grade.
- 28 (2) Students in kindergarten through grade three (3) who are
- 29 identified by the classroom teacher as in danger of not being able to read at
- 30 grade level by the end of the school year shall should receive intensive
- 31 reading instruction during their regularly scheduled reading time throughout
- 32 the regular school year.
- 33 (3) Any local school district may, at the option of its board of
- 34 directors, require a student in grade four (4) or five (5) who did not perform
- 35 at grade level to attend summer school to be eligible for promotion to the

- 1 (c) The State Board of Education is hereby authorized to promulgate 2 rules and regulations for the implementation of this section.
- 3 (d) The State Board of Education is authorized to fund, from any funds
- 4 available for such purposes, the programs required by this section for
- 5 students in kindergarten through grade three (K-3) and any programs required
- 6 by State Board of Education regulations such as, but not limited to, the
- 7 following:
- 8 (1) Tutoring;
- 9 (2) Summer school educational services;
- 10 (3) Additional certified personnel to provide intensive
- 11 instruction in reading throughout the school year;
- 12 (4) Staff development for teachers; and
- 13 (5) Hot meal programs.
- 14 (e) Any local school district may apply to the Director of the
- 15 Department of Education for a waiver for use of in-school and summer school
- 16 remediation funds.
- 17 (f) The savings from not providing free summer school and summer school
- 18 transportation to students in grades four (4) and five (5) who did not perform
- 19 at grade level during the regular school year should be expended in the
- 20 intensive reading instruction program provided throughout the school year to
- 21 students in kindergarten through grade three (3) who are identified by the
- 22 classroom teacher as in danger of not being able to read at grade level by the

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- 25 SECTION 2. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature
- 26 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code
- 27 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

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- 29 SECTION 3. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to
- 30 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect
- 31 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without
- 32 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
- 33 act are declared to be severable.

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- 35 SECTION 4. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are
- 36 hereby repealed.

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         SECTION 5. EMERGENCY. It is found and determined by the Eighty First
 3 General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the effective operation of
 4 Arkansas public schools is dependent upon immediate clarification of the
 5 grades in which students not performing at grade level during the regular
 6 school year will be required to attend summer school for promotion to the next
 7 grade and whether State or local monies will be used to fund summer school and
 8 that failure to implement this act immediately will result in confusion and
 9 cause undue hardships to local school districts. Therefore, an emergency is
10 declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the
11 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on
12 the date of its approval by the Governor. If the bill is neither approved nor
13 vetoed by the Governor, it shall become effective on the expiration of the
14 period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill. If the bill is
15 vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, it shall become effective
16 on the date the last house overrides the veto.
