28	authorize local school districts to initiate and maintain pub	olic school

32	(b) As used in this act, "four-day school week" means	an educationa	al_
33	program in which all students attend school for four (4) days	a week but r	10
34	fewer than the total number of hours required by the Arkansas	Standards fo	or

3 6	(a) The board of directors of any school district is	uthorized to	

1 initiate and maintain a four-day school week in any or all of the public 2 schools in the district. 3 (d) The State Board of Education shall establish appropriate standards, 4 guidelines, rules, and regulations for the determination of average daily 5 membership of school districts and for the distribution of state aid to each 6 local school district that elects to operate any or all of the public schools 7 of such district on a four-day week basis, to provide such district with an 8 equitable share of such aid funds designated to equate a four-day school week 9 operation by such district to the educational opportunities provided by a 10 district offering a five-day school week. Provided, however, that a school 11 district shall not receive any more state financial aid for offering a four-12 day school week of instruction than it would have received for offering a 13 five-day week of instruction. 14 15 SECTION 2. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature 16 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code 17 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code. 18 19 SECTION 3. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to 20 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect 21 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without 22 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this 23 act are declared to be severable. 24 25 SECTION 4.
