            (b) In actions under this section involving cutting and removing

1 (c) Criminal mischief in the first degree is a Class C felony if the 2 amount of actual damage is five hundred dollars (\$500) or more. Otherwise, it 3 is a Class A Misdemeanor. (d) In actions under this section involving cutting and removing 5 timber from the property of another, there shall be imposed in addition to the 6 penalty in subsection (c) of this section, a fine of not more than two (2) 7 times the value of the timber destroyed or damaged; provided, however, that in 8 addition to the above, the court can require the defendant to make restitution 9 to the owner of the timber." 10 11 SECTION 2. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature 12 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code 13 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code. 14 15 SECTION 3. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to 16 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect 17 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without 18 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this 19 act are declared to be severable. 20 21 SECTION 4.
