21	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code 17-93-102 is amended to read as follows:

23	As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires:
24	(1) Practice of Physical physical therapy means: the treatment of a
25	human being by the use of exercise, massage, heat or cold, air, light, water,
26	electricity, or sound for the purpose of correcting or alleviating any
27	physical or mental condition, or preventing the development of any physical or
28	mental disability, or the performance of tests of neuromuscular function as an
29	aid to the diagnosis or treatment of any human condition. However, physical

33	disability or other health-related conditions in order to determine a physical
34	therapy diagnosis, prognosis, and planned therapeutic intervention.
35	(B) Alleviating impairments and functional limitations by
36	designing, implementing, and modifying therapeutic interventions that include:

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1 therapeutic exercise, functional training in self care as it relates to 2 patient mobility and community access, manual therapy techniques, including soft tissue massage, manual traction, connective tissue massage, therapeutic 3 massage, and mobilization (passive movement accomplished within normal range 4 5 of motion of the joint, but excluding spinal manipulation and adjustment), assistive and adaptive devices and equipment as it relates to patient mobility 6 and community access, physical agents, mechanical and electrotherapeutic 7 8 modalities, and patient-related instruction. 24	SECTION 2. Subchapter 3 of Chapter 93 of Title 17 is amended by adding

27	(a)(1) A licensed physical therapist shall complete two (2) continuing
28	education units (CEUs), equivalent to twenty (20) contact hours, in each
29	<u>biennium.</u>
30	(2) A licensed physical therapist assistant shall complete one
31	(1) continuing education unit (CEU), equivalent to ten (10) contact hours, in
32	each biennium.
33	(b) The board shall approve continuing education units (CEUs) and their
34	program content.

8	SECTION 3. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature

13	any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect
14	other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without
