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19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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21	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code 14-27-105 is amended to read as follows:
22	"14-27-105. Annual report to General Assembly.
23	(a) By January 31 of the year following the close of each calendar
24	year's deliberations by the council, the secretary of the cooperation council
25	in each county shall prepare a report of the determinations and
26	recommendations, if any, of the council in each of the required service areas
27	of review.
28	(b) Each county's report shall be compiled by the secretary and
29	forwarded to the Joint Interim Committee on City, County, and Local Affairs of
30	the Arkansas General Assembly House and Senate Interim Committees on City,
31	County and Local Affairs for its their consideration.
32	(c) This annual report must be received by the <del>committee</del> <u>committees</u> no
33	later than April 1 of each year."
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35	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code 14-272-101(a) is amended to read as follows:
36	"(a) There is hereby created the Rural Fire Departments Study

1 Commission, to be composed of sixteen (16) members to be appointed in the 2 manner and to represent various interests as follows: (1) Three (3) members of the Joint Interim Committee on Insurance 3 – 4 and Commerce, one (1) to be a Senator and two (2) to be Representatives, to be 5 appointed by the cochairmen of the Joint Interim Committee on Insurance and 6 Commerce; (2) Three (3) members of the Joint Interim Committee on City, 7 8 County, and Local Affairs, one (1) to be a Senator and two (2) to be 9 Representatives, to be appointed by the cochairmen of the Joint Interim 10 Committee on City, County, and Local Affairs; 11 (1) Two (2) members of the House Interim Committee on Insurance 12 and Commerce to be appointed by the chair of that committee, and one (1) 13 member of the Senate Interim Committee on Insurance and Commerce to be 14 appointed by the chair of that committee; 15 (2) Two (2) members of the House Interim Committee on City, 16 County and Local Affairs to be appointed by the chair of that committee, and 17 one (1) member of the Senate Interim Committee on City, County and Local Affairs to be appointed by the chair of that committee; 18 19 (3) Two (2) members of the House of Representatives, to be 20 appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; 21 (4) Two (2) members of the Senate, to be appointed by the 22 President Pro Tempore of the Senate; (5) One (1) member representing the Arkansas Farm Bureau 23 24 Federation, to be recommended by the Arkansas Farm Bureau Federation and 25 appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; 26 (6) One (1) member representing the Independent Insurance Agents 27 of Arkansas, to be recommended by the Independent Insurance Agents of Arkansas and appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; 2.8 29 (7) One (1) member representing the County Judges Association, to 30 be recommended by the County Judges Association and appointed by the Speaker 31 of the House of Representatives; 32 (8) One (1) member representing the Arkansas Rural Fire Fighters 33 Association, to be recommended by the Arkansas Rural Fire Fighters Association 34 and appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; 35 (9) One (1) member representing the Arkansas Council of 36 Professional Fire Fighters, to be recommended by the Arkansas Council of

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1 Professional Fire Fighters and appointed by the Speaker of the House of 2 Representatives; 3 (10) One (1) member representing the Arkansas Municipal League, 4 to be recommended by the Arkansas Municipal League and appointed by the 5 Speaker of the House of Representatives." 6 SECTION 3. Arkansas Code 14-272-104 is amended to read as follows: 7 8 "14-272-104. Biennial reports. The commission shall submit a biennial report and its recommendations 9 10 for any proposed legislation to the Joint Interim Committee House and Senate 11 Interim Committees on Insurance and Commerce and the Joint Interim Committee 12 House and Senate Interim Committees on City, County, and Local Affairs of the 13 Arkansas General Assembly on or before September 1 of each even-numbered 14 year." 15 16 SECTION 4. Arkansas Code 26-60-104 is amended to read as follows: 17 "26-60-104. Rules and regulations. The Director of the Department of Finance and Administration is 18 19 authorized to promulgate rules and regulations to carry out the purposes of

20 this chapter which shall be submitted to the Joint Interim Committee <u>House and</u> 21 <u>Senate Interim Committees</u>, or Standing Committees, on City, County, and Local 22 Affairs."

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24 SECTION 5. Section 3(b) and Section 4 of uncodified Act 1265 of 1995 25 are hereby amended to read as follows:

"(b) If the Geological Commission votes against the merger of any or all of its programs or divisions it shall conduct a quality management review of the programs of the Geological Commission and specifically review the location, cost and equality of the Arkansas Geology Museum and determine whether it is in the best interest of the state for the museum to remain a stand alone entity or merge with the Museum of Natural Science and History or other museum. The Geological Commission is authorized to transfer the museum and all of its duties, powers, functions, actions, assets, properties and appropriations at any time. If the Geological Commission votes to merge any or all of its programs or divisions with the Soil and Water Conservation Commission, the quality management review shall be conducted by the Soil and

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1 Water Conservation Commission on such programs or divisions. A report of the 2 results of the quality management review shall be prepared and filed no later 3 than July 1, 1996 with the Governor, the Joint Interim Committee <u>House and</u> 4 <u>Senate Interim Committees</u> on State Agencies and Governmental Affairs and the 5 Joint Interim Committee <u>House and Senate Interim Committees</u> on City, County 6 and Local Affairs."

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8 "SECTION 4. Both the Arkansas Geological Commission and the Soil and 9 Water Conservation Commission shall also prepare and file no later than July 10 1, 1996 a report to the Governor, the Joint Interim Committee <u>House and Senate</u> 11 <u>Interim Committees</u> on State Agencies and Governmental Affairs, and the Joint 12 <del>Interim Committee</del> <u>House and Senate Interim Committees</u> on City, County, and 13 Local Affairs regarding the benefits of the merger in the future."

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15 SECTION 6. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature 16 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code 17 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

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19 SECTION 7. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to 20 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect 21 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without 22 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this 23 act are declared to be severable.

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25 SECTION 8. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are 26 hereby repealed.

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SECTION 9. EMERGENCY. It is hereby found and determined by the General Assembly that Act 10 of the First Extraordinary Session of 1995 abolished the original ten subject matter joint interim committees of the General Assembly and in their place established House interim committees and Senate interim committees; that as a result, various sections of the Arkansas Code that refer to the joint interim committees should now refer to the House and Senate interim committees; that this act so provides; and that this act should go into effect as soon as possible in order to make those sections of the Arkansas Code compatible. Therefore an emergency is declared to exist and

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1	this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace,
2	health and safety shall become effective on the date of its approval by the
3	Governor. If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it
4	shall become effective on the expiration of the period of time during which
5	the Governor may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the
6	veto is overridden, it shall become effective on the date the last house
7	overrides the veto.
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
