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22	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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24	SECTION 1. LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS. The General Assembly finds and
25	acknowledges that, while character and citizenship is primarily a parental
26	responsibility, it must not remain isolated there. The General Assembly
27	further finds that character and citizenship education must be strengthened in
28	public school to prepare young people for positive dealings with the social
29	order of today.
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31	SECTION 2. (a) The Director of the General Education Division of the
32	Department of Education shall provide a clearinghouse for information on
33	nonsectarian practices in character and citizenship education programs within
34	Arkansas and across the nation in order to assist local schools to strengthen
35	character and citizenship education as a local option for school district
36	curriculum in kindergarten through grade twelve (K-12).

1	(b) The director shall ensure that information on nonsectarian
2	practices and models is disseminated to all school districts in the state by
3	no later than August 1, 1998, and is updated after each regular session of the
4	General Assembly.
5	(c) During each interim of the biennium, the director shall provide a
6	progress report on the implementation and effectiveness of this act to the
7	members of the House and Senate Interim Committees on Education.
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9	SECTION 3. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature
10	are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code
11	Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.
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13	SECTION 4. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to
14	any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect
15	other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without
16	the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
17	act are declared to be severable.
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19	SECTION 5. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are
20	hereby repealed.
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
