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25	SECTION 1. The statutory text of the Arkansas Code, the same as exis	stec
26	on January 1, 1997, and all acts or parts of acts not codified because they	<u>7</u>
27	were deemed not to be of a general and permanent nature are hereby declared	l to
28	be the statutory law of this state.	
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30	SECTION 2. To the extent the statutory text of the Arkansas Code as	of
31	January 1, 1997 conflicts with acts of the General Assembly, the language i	<u>ln</u>
32	the Arkansas Code will prevail.	
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34	SECTION 3. All enactments of the Eighty-first General Assembly will	
35	prevail over the Arkansas Code as it existed on January 1, 1997. It is	
36	anticipated that the codification of the enactments of the Eighty-first	

1 General Assembly will be enacted by the Eighty-second General Assembly and 2 similar enactments by successive General Assemblies. 3 SECTION 4. Arkansas Code 1-2-101(c) is repealed. (c) Except as otherwise specifically provided, the enactment of this 6 Code by the General Assembly is not intended to alter the substantive law in existence on the effective date of this Code. It is not the purpose of the 8 enactment of this Code to change or alter the effect of any law in existence 9 on December 31, 1987. 10 11 SECTION 5. Arkansas Code 1-2-103 is repealed. 4 1-2-103. Repeal of prior laws by Code - Exceptions. (a) All acts, codes, and statutes, and all parts of them and all 14 amendments to them of a general and permanent nature in effect on December 31, 15 1987, are repealed unless: (1) Expressly continued by specific provision of this Code; (2) Omitted improperly or erroneously as a consequence of 17 — 18 compilation, revision, or both, of the laws enacted prior to this Code, 19 including, without limitation, any omissions that may have occurred during the 20 compilation, revision, or both, of the laws comprising this Code; or (3) Omitted, changed, or modified by the Arkansas Code Revision 22 Commission, or its predecessors, in a manner not authorized by the laws or the 23 constitutions of Arkansas in effect at the time of the omission, change, or 24 modification. (b) In the event one of the above exceptions should be applicable, the 26 law as it existed on December 31, 1987, shall continue to be valid, effective, 27 and controlling. 2.8 29 SECTION 6. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature 30 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code 31 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code. 32 SECTION 7. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to 33 34 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect 35 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without 36 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this

1 act are declared to be severable. 3 SECTION 8. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are 4 hereby repealed. 5 6 SECTION 9. EMERGENCY. It is found and determined by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the statutory language of the Arkansas 8 Code can be attacked by comparison to the underlying acts of the General 9 Assembly; that designating the text of the Arkansas Code as the paramount law 10 of this state, whether the codification correctly reflects the underlying 11 enactments, will assure the readers that the published code can be relied 12 upon; that until this act becomes effective the statutory law of this state 13 can only be settled through litigation; and that this act should therefor go 14 into effect immediately in order to assure the users of the Arkansas Code that 15 they may rely upon its contents. Therefore an emergency is declared to exist 16 and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public 17 peace, health and safety shall become effective on the date of its approval by 18 the Governor. If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it 19 shall become effective on the expiration of the period of time during which 20 the Governor may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the 21 veto is overridden, it shall become effective on the date the last house 22 overrides the veto. 23 24 25 26 27 2.8 29 30 31 32 33 34 35
