7	of findings and judgments issued by juries in this state is subject to	
8	guestion. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being	
9	9 immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and	
10	safety shall become effective on the date of its approval by the Governor. I	
11	the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall become	
12	effective on the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor	
13	3 may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is	
14	overridden, it shall become effective on the date the last house overrides the	
15	veto.
