- 15 RESTRICTION AND TRANSFER PROVISION. Of the amounts allocated in Section 87

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        SECTION 124. APPLICATIONS FOR SERVICES. In the event that existing
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   services now funded from federal funds appropriated by Section 39(04) are

35 by Section 39(04) the existing licensed and/or certified DDS providers shall

Personal Care 17 18 reimbursement rates shall be established at \$12.35 per unit, or such lesser amounts as may be established for a program of client directed personal care 19 20 which may be developed and implemented by the Department of Human Services. 21 SECTION 126. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES. By March 31, 2.2 23 of 1998, for the fiscal year 1997-98 and by March 31, of 1999, for the fiscal 24 year 1998-99, the Division of Mental Health Services will estimate whether there will be any savings from the funds appropriated in Section 55 for the Tracking and Treatment Program. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this Act or the 17 18 application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such 19 invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Act which 20 can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this 21 end the provisions of this Act are declared to be severable. 2.2 2.3 SECTION 131. GENERAL REPEALER. All laws and parts of laws in conflict 24 with this Act are hereby repealed. 2.5 SECTION 132. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by 2.6 27 the Eighty-First General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of 28 Arkansas prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 1997 is essential to the 29 operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 1997 could work irreparable harm 33 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental 34 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act

being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, Section 115 shall be in full force and effect from and after the date

2	and effect from and after July 1, 1997.
