35 SECTION 34. COOPERATIVE EDUCATION SERVICES COORDINATING COUNCIL. There

- 1 is hereby created a Council, to be known as the Cooperative Education Services
- 2 Coordinating Council. The Cooperative Education Services Coordinating Council
