20	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSA	AS:

22	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code 17-20-405(a)(2) is hereby rep	pealed.	
23	(2) The manager, person, or teacher in charge of the	chool must h	ave
24	had at least three (3) years experience as a registered barb	e r before he	may
25	be put in charge of the school as manager.

27	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY. It is hereby found and determin	ned by the Gen	neral
28	Assembly that Act 1056 of 1993 repealed Arkansas Code 17-18-4	106(a) which	
29	provided that no person should manage or operate a barber college unless the		
30	person was an Arkansas resident for at least three years and had at least		
31	three years experience as a barber teacher in an approved barber school or		
32	college; that another section of the Arkansas Code substantially duplicated		
33	that requirement and was inadvertently not repealed by Act 1056; that as a		
34	result, confusion exists in the law; that this act clarifies the law by		
35	fulfilling the intent of Act 1056 of 1993; and that this act	should go in	to
36	effect as soon as possible in order to clarify the law at the	e earliest da	te.

1 Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately 2 necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall 3 become effective on the date of its approval by the Governor. If the bill is 4 neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall become effective on the 5 expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill. 6 If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, it shall 7 become effective on the date the last house overrides the veto. 2.8
