18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE	OF ARKANSAS:	
19			
20	SECTION 1. In any county in which a natural	disaster, including but	not
21	limited to a tornado or flood, results in the cour	ty being declared a disa	ster
22	area by the Governor, an appropriate official of t	he United States governm	nent,
23	or the county judge of the county, the county judg	e is authorized to use	
24	county labor and equipment on private property to	provide services which a	ire
25	required as a result of the natural disaster.		
26			
27	SECTION 2. All provisions of this act of a	general and permanent na	ıture
28	are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annota	ted and the Arkansas Cod	le
29	Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in	the Code.	
30			
31	SECTION 3. If any provision of this act or	the application thereof	to
32	any person or circumstance is held invalid, such i	nvalidity shall not affe	ect
33	other provisions or applications of the act which	can be given effect with	iout
34	the invalid provision or application, and to this	end the provisions of th	nis
35	act are declared to be severable.

SECTION 4. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are 2 hereby repealed. 3 SECTION 5. EMERGENCY. It is hereby found and determined by the General 4 5 Assembly that devastating tornadoes and flooding recently occurred in several counties of the state; that several of the affected counties have been declared disaster areas by the Governor; that as a result of the disaster considerable cleanup services and other services will be required on private property as well as public property; that it is in the best interests of the counties involved in such disasters as well as residents of those counties 11 that the devastated areas be cleaned up and restored as quickly as is 12 feasible; that the use of county equipment and labor to the extent the county 13 judge deems appropriate would be beneficial to everyone involved, and that 14 this act is designed to permit the use of county equipment and labor on 15 private property in these limited circumstances and should be given effect 16 immediately. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being 17 immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 18 safety shall become effective on the date of its approval by the Governor. If 19 the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall become 20 effective on the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor 21 may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is 22 overridden, it shall become effective on the date the last house overrides the 23 veto. 24 2.5 26 27 2.8 29 30 31 32 33 34 35
