1	(c) APPROPRIATION TRANSFER PROCEDURES. The Director of the Arkansas
2	Department of Higher Education shall determine the difference between the

29	expenditure by any regulation of the Board of Higher Education.

SECTION 39. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained in this Act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this Act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

19 SECTION 40. CODE. All provisions of this Act of a general and 20 permanent nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the 21 Arkansas Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code. 22

23 SECTION 41. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this Act or the 24 application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such 25 invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Act which 26 can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this 27 end the provisions of this Act are declared to be severable.

29 SECTION 42. GENERAL REPEALER. All laws and parts of laws in conflict 30 with this Act are hereby repealed.

32 SECTION 43. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the 33 Eighty-First General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas 34 prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that 35 the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 1997 is essential to the operation of 36 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in

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1	the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
2	date of this Act beyond July 1, 1997 could work irreparable harm upon the
3	proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
4	Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
5	necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
6	safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 1997.
