35	15-10-502. Alternative Fuels Commission.

36 (a) There is hereby created the Alternative Fuels Commission to be

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1	composed of nine (9) members appointed by the Governor, plus one (1) Senator
2	and one (1) Representative serving on the Joint Committee on Energy of the
3	General Assembly to be appointed by the cochairmen of the Joint Committee on
4	Energy. The Governor shall appoint one (1) consumer representative and two (2)
5	members representing the natural gas industry of this state and, in making the
6	remainder of his appointments, should give consideration to the appointees'
7	knowledge of and experience in banking, farming, geology, chemistry, biology,
8	and engineering.
9	(b) One (1) commissioner shall be selected from each of the (4) four
10	congressional districts, and the remaining five (5) commissioners shall serve
11	from the state at large.
12	(c)(1) The Governor-appointed members of the commission shall serve
13	terms of four (4) years.
14	(2) The members appointed from the Joint Committee on Energy shall
15	serve two-year terms.
16	(d) In the event a vacancy occurs on the commission due to death,
17	resignation, or other cause, the vacancy shall be filled by appointment by the
18	Governor or cochairmen of the Joint Committee on Energy, whichever is
19	appropriate, of a person eligible for the initial appointment as set forth in
20	this section to serve for the remainder of the unexpired portion of the term

22	(e) The commission shall annually elect one (1) of its members as

12	Advisory Committee shall be personally liable for his acts or omissions within

20	<u>25-25-104. Funding.</u>
21	In addition to the funds appropriated by the General Assembly to the
22	commission, the commission may accept funds from any other public or private
23	source.
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
