8	URGING ALL CURRENT AND FUTURE MEMBERS OF THE GENERAL
9	ASSEMBLY TO EXCLUDE FOOD FROM ANY FUTURE INCREASES IN THE

13	URGING ALL CURRENT AND FUTURE MEMBERS OF
14	THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY TO EXCLUDE FOOD
15	FROM ANY FUTURE INCREASES IN THE STATE
16	SALES TAX.

18	WHEREAS, sales and excise taxes are the most regressive kinds of taxes
19	that states can impose; and
20	
21	WHEREAS, Arkansas sales and excise taxes account for half of total
22	Arkansas state and local tax revenues; and
23	
24	WHEREAS, the sales and excise tax is very high compared to the national
25	average, ranking 11th nationwide as a share of personal income; and
26	
27	WHEREAS, between 1980 and 1993, Arkansas sales and excise taxes grew
28	from 4% of personal income to 4.9%, placing them 25% above the national
29	average; and
30	
31	WHEREAS, Arkansas general sales taxes rose from 2.3% of personal income
32	in 1980 to 3.4% in 1993, which was the fastest general sales tax growth rate
33	of any state in the nation; and
34	
35	WHEREAS, Arkansas sales tax base is considerably broader than the base
36	in most other states due in part to its general sales tax on groceries; and

1 2 WHEREAS, Arkansas is one of only 19 states that applies its general 3 sales tax to groceries; and 5 WHEREAS, these factors result in low-income Arkansans paying more than 6 6 times as large a share of their incomes in sales and excise taxes as do the 7 wealthiest people in the State; and 9 WHEREAS, exempting groceries from all future increases in the sales tax 10 will relieve a portion of the State tax burden from all taxpayers of the 11 state, especially low and middle income taxpayers. 12 13 NOW THEREFORE, 14 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE EIGHTY-FIRST GENERAL 15 ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN: 16 17 THAT the General Assembly urges all current and future members of the 18 Arkansas General Assembly to exempt groceries from any and all increases in 19 the State sales tax. 20 21 22 23 24 25 26 27 28 29 30 31 32 33
