14	URGING THE ARKANSAS HIGHWAY AND
15	TRANSPORTATION DEPARTMENT TO MARK ALL
16	PUBLIC HIGHWAYS IN ARKANSAS WITH
17	REFLECTIVE MARKERS TO INCREASE
18	VISIBILITY OF HIGHWAYS DURING INCLEMENT
19	WEATHER.

21	WHEREAS, the very nature of black-top or asphalt surfacing for public
22	roads and highways is that it is dark or black in color and therefore
23	inherently hard to see to drive and maintain control on after dark and, during
24	rainy extremes, it becomes even more difficult to maintain visibility when it
25	rains after dark; and
26	
27	WHEREAS, much research has been conducted on making highways more
28	visible and on improving the visibility of public roads and highways
29	throughout the United States and in the practical use of devices and materials
30	such as reflective striping, in-surface reflectors, and bright fluorescent
31	paints have vastly improved the visibility on federal highways and primary
32	roads throughout this country; and
33	
34	WHEREAS, the responsibility for all federal and interstate highways and
35	the primary and secondary highways of the Arkansas state highway system falls
36	upon the Arkansas Highway and Transportation Department; and

1 2 WHEREAS, improved visibility of all the federal and state highways in 3 Arkansas would enhance traffic and highway safety for the driving public and 4 protect the health and safety of all of Arkansas' citizens, their families, 5 and children, 7 NOW THEREFORE, 8 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE EIGHTY-FIRST GENERAL 9 ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN: 10 11 THAT the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas respectfully urges 12 the State Highway Commission and the Arkansas Highway and Transportation 13 Department to develop a plan and to expend the necessary financial resources 14 as are needed to mark all public highways in Arkansas with reflective markers 15 or devices to increase visibility during inclement weather of all public roads 16 and highways under their control and responsibility; and 17 18 FURTHER RESOLVED THAT a copy of this resolution, after its concurrence 19 by the Senate, be transmitted by the Chief Clerk of the House to the Arkansas 20 State Highway Commission for its consideration and comment. 21 22 23 24 25 26 27 28
