16	REQUESTING THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO
17	CREATE A POOLING MECHANISM FOR INSURING
18	AGAINST NATURAL DISASTER RISK

20	WHEREAS, catastrophic natural disasters are occurring with greater frequency, a trend that is likely to continue for several
21	decades, according to prominent scientists; and,
22	WHEREAS, portions of Arkansas lie in the area of the New Madrid fault and are susceptible to earthquake damage; and,
23	WHEREAS, the federal government has responded to disasters by appropriating relief funds which provide only short-term assistance
24	to victims, but long-term burdens to taxpayers; and,
25	WHEREAS, the increasing reliance on federal disaster relief has overshadowed the need to perform more comprehensive disaster
26	planning and rely on private insurance for protection against disaster risks; and,
27	WHEREAS, many Arkansans are not able to obtain adequate insurance coverage for the risk of natural disaster, particularly
28	earthquake damage.
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30	NOW THEREFORE,
31	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE EIGHTY-FIRST GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
32	THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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34	That the House of Representatives hereby requests the United States Congress to pass legislation, in the 105th Congress, which would
35	enable those who live in areas of high risk from natural disasters to assume more responsibility for their actions by insuring against such risks.
36	We believe Congress should create a pooling mechanism for the spreading of disaster risk, in order to encourage the continued availability and

1	affordability of private insurance.

4	House of Representatives, to the President of the Senate and Speaker of the House of the United States Congress.
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
