16	WHEREAS, Dr. William H. Townsend was born near West Point, Mississippi,
17	and moved with his family to Earle, Arkansas, when he was four years old; and
18	WHEREAS, he earned a B.S. degree in agriculture from Tuskegee Institute
19	at Tuskegee, Alabama, in 1941; and
20	WHEREAS, he was inducted into the United States Army, serving for 45
21	months in Northern Africa, Italy, France, Germany and England, and studying at
22	Nottingham University for nine months while in England; and
23	WHEREAS, he attended Howard University in Washington, D.C. for a year of
24	pre-medical studies and then in 1950 earned a degree in optometry from
25	Northern Illinois College of Optometry in Chicago; and
26	WHEREAS, in August of 1950, upon passing the Arkansas Optometric Board
27	and beginning his practice in Little Rock, Dr. Townsend became the first
28	African-American licensed optometrist in Arkansas; and
29	WHEREAS, in his 46 years of practice he has found time for public
30	service, contributing to the community in his duties as president of the
31	Arkansas Council on Human Relations, a member of the local, state, and
32	national Optometric Associations, receiving the Arkansas Optometrist of the
33	Year Award in 1981, a lifetime member of the NAACP, board member of the Urban
34	League, deacon and trustee of Mount Zion Baptist Church, treasurer of
35	Professional Service, Inc., member of Pi Lambda Chapter of Alpha Phi Alpha,
36	member of the Masonic Lodge, member of the Leadership Roundtable, board member

- 1 and executive committee member of the National Conference of Christians and
- 2 Jews, member of the board of First Commercial Bank of Little Rock and
- 3 recipient of the Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Award presented by Arkansas
- 4 Cultural Enterprises, Inc.; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Dr. Townsend was elected to 12 terms in the Arkansas House of
- 6 Representatives, where he served for 24 years; and
- WHEREAS, in 1952 he married Miss Billye Gene McNeely and they raised
- 8 three daughters, Yolanda, Terezenha and LaJuan, instilling in them sound moral
- 9 values and a willingness to work hard for the benefit of their families and
- 10 communities;
- 11 WHEREAS, Dr. Townsend has been honored with numerous awards recognizing
- 12 his personal and professional achievements, as well as his unceasing efforts
- 13 to protect civil rights and improve education and health care for all
- 14 citizens; and
