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24	WHEREAS, school-based counseling services have numerous advantages as	
25	compared to traditional counseling approaches; and	
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27	WHEREAS, because schools are part of the everyday lives of children an	nd
28	the efficacy of counseling services is increased when services are integrate	ed
29	into everyday settings, schools have the potential to be a venue whereby	
30	access to mental health services is more readily available to parents and	
31	children. In addition, parents and children are more likely to keep

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34	WHEREAS, schools are ideologically compatible with the steps that show	ıld
35	be taken in counseling children and families because they emphasize develop:	ing
36	competence and reducing barriers to learning; and

2 WHEREAS, schools can be powerful factors, both negatively and positively 3 in children's mental health and school-based counseling services can be 4 important elements in creating school environments that are healthy and safe 5 for children in general and for children with emotional disturbances in 6 particular; and

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8 WHEREAS, research shows that families now often lack available help when 9 they are having "normal" crises and the counseling service system generally 10 has failed to respond to this important change in family life. Because of a 11 school's universality and the relative lack of stigma associated with services 12 provided within the school, school-based services are one way that the gap in 13 counseling service delivery can be filled. By so doing, relief can be given 14 to children and families in general, and families "on the edge" can be 15 prevented from developing more serious problems; and

WHEREAS, early adolescence is a time when serious problems often begin with increased depression and decreased achievement motivation; and with increased depression and decreased achievement motivation; and

21 WHEREAS, a number of mental health problems of serious social 22 importance, such as conduct disorders, are especially prevalent during the 23 high school years, and some chronic adult mental illnesses often first appear 24 at that time; and

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26 WHEREAS, the case now appears sufficiently strong for school-based 27 services to be provided at all school levels.
