18 WHEREAS, the admission of cameras in the courtroom serves as a way to
19 familiarize and educate citizens about the judicial branch of government and
20 the jury system; and
21

22 WHEREAS, the Judiciary of Arkansas has continued to use great wisdom and
23 discretion coupled with restraint in considering whether to allow cameras in
24 their courtrooms; and
25

26 WHEREAS, the use of cameras in some complex and protracted cases can
27 serve to distort the public's perception of a trial and how it is seen by the
28 jury.

30 NOW THEREFORE,

31 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE EIGHTY-FIRST GENERAL
32 ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
33

34 THAT the House of Representatives urges the Judiciary of Arkansas to
35 continue to use wisdom and discretion coupled with restraint in considering
36 whether or not to allow cameras in the courtroom during trial proceedings and,

1 that whenever the use of cameras is allowed, urging the Judiciary to consider
2 allowing cameras to broadcast the proceeding only when the jury is present so
3 that the public may see the same proceedings as those serving on the jury.
