- 27 SECTION 5. SPECIAL LANGUAGE APPROPRIATION TRANSFER PROCEDURES. In the
- 28 event that sufficient appropriation has not been provided for the payment of
- 29 Career Recognition Payments for any state agency or institution due to the
- 30 enactment of this Act or any other act approved by the Eighty-First General
- 31 Assembly which raises the compensation level of state employees, the agency or
