34	any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity s	hall not affe	ct

        SECTION 4. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are
 4 hereby repealed.

         SECTION 5. EMERGENCY. It is hereby found and determined by the General
 6
 7 Assembly that the state minimum wage in Arkansas is unreasonably low; that
 8 this act increases the state minimum wage to parallel the federal minimum
 9 wage; that this act should go into effect on July 1, 1997; and that unless
10 this emergency clause is adopted the act will not be effective until after
11 July 1, 1997. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this
12 act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
13 and safety shall be in full force and effect beginning July 1, 1997.
