19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
20

21 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES. There is hereby established for the
22 Office of Emergency Services for the 1997-99 biennium, the following maximum
23 number of regular employees whose salaries shall be governed by the provisions
24 of the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act (Arkansas Code §§21-5-201
25 et seq.), or its successor, and all laws amendatory thereto. Provided,
26 however, that any position to which a specific maximum annual salary is set
27 out herein in dollars, shall be exempt from the provisions of said Uniform
28 Classification and Compensation Act. All persons occupying positions
29 authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions of the Regular
30 Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-101), or its
31 successor.

14 SECTION 16. APPROPRIATIONS. There is hereby appropriated to the Office
15 of Emergency Services, to be payable from the General Improvement Fund or its
16 successor fund or fund accounts, for repairs to the infrastructure of
17 Arkadelphia, Arkansas, the sum of \$2,000,000.

18
19 SECTION 17. APPROPRIATIONS. There is hereby appropriated, to the
20 Office of Emergency Services, to be payable from the Disaster Assistance Fund,
21 for the provision of Disaster Assistance grants by the Office of Emergency
22 Services to Washington County which has been declared a disaster area by the
23 Governor, for the sum of \$500,000.

25 SECTION 18. The Chief Fiscal Officer of the State may transfer on his
26 books and those of the State Treasurer an amount not to exceed five hundred
27 thousand (\$500,000), as is needed to provide funds to be expended under the
28 provision of Section 17 herein, from the Economic Development of Arkansas Fund
29 to the Disaster Assistance Fund to provide funds for the appropriation

32 ~~SECTION 19. SPECIAL LANGUAGE POSITION TRANSFER. Upon approval of the~~
33 Chief Fiscal Officer, the State Office of Emergency Services is hereby
34 authorized to transfer positions between appropriations as may be required
35 should a disaster occur which results in a Presidential Disaster Proclamation

1 and/or when an employee occupies one position which is to be paid from two or
2 more appropriations during a single fiscal year.

3

4 SECTION 20. (a) It is hereby found and determined by the General
5 Assembly that the city of Arkadelphia and its surrounding area was one of the
6 most tragically devastated areas in the recent tornado disaster and that the
7 extent of destruction in that area requires the establishment of an entity to
8 coordinate the efforts of rebuilding and revitalizing the Arkadelphia area.
9 This act therefore creates the Arkansas 2025 Commission to accomplish that
10 purpose and this act is to be construed and interpreted in its broadest sense
11 in order to provide maximum assistance to the residents of the Arkadelphia
12 area in recovering from the disaster.

13 (b) There is hereby created the Arkadelphia 2025 Commission to be
14 composed of the Mayor, City Manager, and Chairman of the City Planning
15 Commission of Arkadelphia, the Superintendent of the Arkadelphia Public School
16 District, the member of the Arkansas House of Representatives representing the
17 Arkadelphia area, the member of the Arkansas Senate representing the
18 Arkadelphia area, the County Judge of Clark County, the Presidents of Ouachita
19 Baptist University and Henderson State University, the President and Executive
20 Secretary of the Arkadelphia Chamber of Commerce, and at least an equal number
21 of citizens of the Arkadelphia area to be appointed by the members just named.
22 The Commission shall be as broadly based as possible to represent all the
23 diverse interests and to represent every race, gender, income level, and
24 geographic area.

25 (c) The Commission shall have the following powers and duties:

26 (1) Determine the immediate needs of Arkadelphia and its surrounding
27 area;

28 (2) Determine the long-range needs and opportunities of the Arkadelphia
29 area;

30 (3) Seek and expend funds from all sources, both public and private;

31 (4) Coordinate the activities of the various federal, state, and local
32 agencies as well as the private sector in providing for the economic, social,
33 and physical needs of the area;

34 (5) To serve as the lead agency in the rebuilding and revitalization of
35 the Arkadelphia area;

1 (6) Adopt bylaws and establish goals; and
2 (7) Perform all other powers and functions necessary to fulfill its
3 duties.

4 (d) The Commission shall be subject to audit by the Division of
5 Legislative Audit.

6
7 SECTION 21. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds
8 authorized by this Act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
9 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
10 the restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and
11 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
12 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control
13 laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the
14 Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
15 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

16
17
18 SECTION 22. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
19 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
20 contained in this Act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which
21 this Act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
22 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
23 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
24 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
25 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

26
27 SECTION 23. CODE. All provisions of this Act of a general and
28 permanent nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the
29 Arkansas Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

30
31 SECTION 24. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this Act or the
32 application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such
33 invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Act which
34 can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this
35 end the provisions of this Act are declared to be severable.

SECTION 25. GENERAL REPEALER. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are hereby repealed.

SECTION 26. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the Eighty-First General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 1997 is essential to the operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 1997 could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and Sections 1 through 19 of this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 1997.

It is hereby found and determined by the General Assembly that the city of Arkadelphia and its surrounding area was one of the most tragically devastated areas in the recent tornado disaster; that the extent of destruction in that area requires the establishment of an entity to coordinate the efforts of rebuilding and revitalizing the Arkadelphia area; and that this act creates the Arkansas 2025 Commission to accomplish that purpose. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and Section 20 of this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall become effective on the date of its approval by the Governor. If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall become effective on the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, it shall become effective on the date the last house overrides the veto.
