34	SECTION 3. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized by this Act shall be	· limited to	the

9	SECTION 5. CODE. All provisions of this Act of a general and permanent nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987
10	Annotated and the Arkansas Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

12	SECTION 6. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this Act or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held
13	invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or
14	application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are declared to be severable.

16	SECTION 7. GENERAL REPEALER. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are hereby repealed.
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18	SECTION 8. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the Eighty-first General Assembly that various
19	studies being conducted by the federal government regarding the use of the Red River are nearing completion; that further studies and projects on
20	the Red River will require state participation; and that the provisions of this Act will provide the necessary state resources for such projects.
21	Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
22	safety shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.
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
