4	designated by the Governor or as set out by law shall conduct a study during
5	the 1997-99 biennium as to the need for health care providers in Arkansas and
б	report its findings to the General Assembly on or before October 1, 1998.
7	
8	SECTION 39. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. (a) HIGHER EDUCATION TUITION ADJUSTMENT
9	FUND. The Higher Education Tuition Adjustment Fund is hereby created upon the
10	books of the State Treasurer, State Auditor, and Chief Fiscal Officer of the
11	State. The fund shall consist of such revenues as are allocated to it by law.
12	(b) PURPOSE OF THE FUND. It is the intent of the Arkansas General Assembly
13	that this fund ensures that bona fide Arkansas income taxpayers and their
14	dependents who are residents of a bordering state in a contiguous county to
15	the Arkansas State line which is contiguous to a county where an institution
16	of higher education is located receive the same higher education opportunities
17	as all other said taxpayers. In establishing this policy, it is the intent of
18	the General Assembly that taxpayers should have affordable access to the
19	state's higher education institutions.
20	Further, the Arkansas Department of Higher Education or another
21	appropriate board or agency as designated by the Governor or by law ("agency")
22	will require each institution to track and report the number of qualifying
23	students each year. A list of students who benefit from the out-of-state
24	tuition waiver including their social security number or their Arkansas
25	taxpaying parents' or guardians' names and social security numbers will be
26	furnished by the "agency" to the Department of Finance and Administration for
27	confirmation that they or their parents are employed in Arkansas at a wage in
28	excess of five thousand five hundred dollars (\$5,500) per annum.
29	Documentation should be either an official W-2 form from an Arkansas employer
30	reflecting wages of at least five thousand five hundred dollars (\$5,500) in
31	the tax year prior to enrollment in college; or official employer verification
32	of a current year salary minimum of at least five thousand five hundred
33	dollars (\$5,500) which the college will keep on file for enrollment audit
34	purposes.
35	(c) APPROPRIATION TRANSFER PROCEDURES. The "agency" shall determine the

1	difference between the amount of tuition revenue which would have been
2	generated by charging the approved out-of-state tuition rate to said students
3	as compared to approved in-state or out-of-district rate. Upon such
4	determination, the "agency" shall certify to the Chief Fiscal Officer of the
5	State and the State Treasurer such amounts as are required to be transferred
6	from the Higher Education Tuition Adjustment Fund. Upon receiving such
7	certification, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and the State Treasurer
8	shall cause to be transferred the necessary funds and appropriation to the
9	fund account of the institution receiving such certification from the
10	"agency". In order to provide funding for the appropriation set out as
11	Tuition Adjustment, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall transfer to
12	the Higher Education Tuition Adjustment Fund from the Higher Education Grants
13	Fund Account \$250,000 for each year of the biennium. The remaining amounts
14	required to finance the amount appropriated for Tuition Adjustment shall be
15	transferred from the Higher Education Grants Fund Account after meeting the
16	costs of scholarship and grant programs administered by the "agency".
17	
18	SECTION 40. SPECIAL LANGUAGE - MOVING EXPENSES. Arkansas Code 19-4-522
19	is amended by inserting an additional subsection at the end thereof to read as
20	follows:
21	${}^{\ensuremath{arepsilon}}(e)$ Notwithstanding Arkansas Code 19-4-522 or any other law to the
22	contrary state-supported colleges and universities may utilize maintenance and
23	operation appropriations for the payment of moving expenses of employees,
24	including new hires.
25	
26	SECTION 41. SPECIAL LANGUAGE - SCHOLARSHIPS. The Board of Trustees of
27	any institution of higher education may waive the out-of-state portion of any
28	full tuition scholarship for any full-time student which is provided by
29	unrestricted funds of the institution. Such part as is waived shall not be
30	considered as an expenditure by any regulation of the Board of Higher
31	Education.
32	
33	SECTION 42. SPECIAL LANGUAGE - COLLEGE SAVINGS BONDS. <u>The Department</u>
34	of Higher Education or other agency to which the appropriation for College
35	Savings Bonds is provided shall adopt rules and regulations for the allocation

1	of the funds reappropriated for the development of projects at State		
2	nstitutions of Higher Education and the payment of project costs and expenses		
3	the issuance of the bonds of the Arkansas College Savings General		
4	bligation Bonds Program by the Eighty-First General Assembly to ensure that		
5	funds are allocated and expended in a manner consistent with the provisions of		
б	the Internal Revenue Code applicable to the Arkansas College Savings General		
7	Obligation Bond Program (Program). The funds reappropriated for the		
8	development of projects at State Institutions of Higher Education and the		
9	payment of project costs and expenses of the issuance of the bonds of the		
10	Arkansas College Savings General Obligation Bonds Program by the Eighty-First		
11	General Assembly shall be allocated and expended pursuant to the provisions of		
12	Arkansas Code 6-62-701 et. seq. and other laws of this State. The expenditure		
13	and allocation of funds shall be exempt from any other provisions of state law		
14	which conflicts with any provision of the rules and regulations which rules		
15	and regulations are required to ensure the compliance of the Program with the		
16	applicable provisions of the Internal Revenue Code.		
17			
18	SECTION 43. SPECIAL LANGUAGE - COLLEGE SAVINGS BONDS LIMITS. Arkansas		
19	Code $^{ m b}$ 6-62-708 is amended to read as follows: "The total principal amount of		
20	bonds to be issued during any fiscal biennium shall not exceed three-hundred		
21	million dollars (\$300,000,000), nor shall the principal amount of bonds		
22	outstanding at any time have debt service requirements in excess of twenty-		
23

25	SECTION 44. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. UNALLOCATED COLLEGE SAVINGS BOND		
26	APPROPRIATION. The amount of appropriation for College Savings Bonds projects		
27	allocated for Other Strategic Needs of the State as authorized by Act 1167 of		
28	1995 shall be distributed by the State Board of Higher Education to the two		
29	year institutions of higher education as follows:

23 SECTION 45. SPECIAL LANGUAGE - SAU-TECH. The amount of College Savings 24 Bond Appropriation which is allocated in this act for SAU-TECH may also be 25 utilized for the Fire Training Academy and the Environmental Control Academy. 26

27 SECTION 46. DISBURSEMENT CONTROLS. (A) No contract may be awarded nor 28 obligations otherwise incurred in relation to the project or projects 29 described herein in excess of the State Treasury funds actually available 30 therefor as provided by law. Provided, however, that institutions and 31 agencies listed herein shall have the authority to accept and use grants and 32 donations including Federal funds, and to use its unobligated cash income or 33 funds, or both available to it, for the purpose of supplementing the State 34 Treasury funds for financing the entire costs of the project or projects 35 enumerated herein. Provided further, that the appropriations and funds

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1 otherwise provided by the General Assembly for Maintenance and General
2 Operations of the agency or institutions receiving appropriation herein shall
3 not be used for any of the purposes as appropriated in this Act.
4 (B) Any restrictions contained in the Acts enumerated in the
5 reappropriation sections of this Act, the restrictions of any applicable
6 provisions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary
7 Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law and any other applicable fiscal

8 control laws of this State and regulations promulgated by the Department of 9 Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied 10 with in disbursement of any funds provided by this Act unless specifically 11 provided otherwise by law.

12

13 SECTION 47. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General 14 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations 15 contained in this Act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which 16 this Act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive 17 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget 18 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or 19 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative 20 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

22 SECTION 48. CODE. All provisions of this Act of a general and 23 permanent nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and 24 the Arkansas Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code. 25

SECTION 49. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this Act or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Act which or application, and to this on the provisions of this Act are declared to be severable.

32 SECTION 50. GENERAL REPEALER. All laws and parts of laws in conflict 33 with this Act are hereby repealed.

34

35 SECTION 51. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the

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1	Eighty-First General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas
2	prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that
3	previous General Assemblies have provided appropriations for the projects
4	provided or enumerated in this act; that certain appropriations will expire
5	before the adjournment of the General Assembly; and that if such
6	appropriations expire, the projects and programs authorized herein will cease
7	thereby depriving the citizens of the State of the benefits to be derived from
8	such projects. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this
9	Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
10	and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its
11	passage and approval.
