19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:  
20

21 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES. There is hereby established for the  
22 Department of Parks and Tourism for the 1997-99 biennium, the following  
23 maximum number of regular employees whose salaries shall be governed by the  
24 provisions of the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act (Arkansas Code  
25 §21-5-201 et seq.), or its successor, and all laws amendatory thereto.  
26 Provided, however, that any position to which a specific maximum annual salary  
27 is set out herein in dollars, shall be exempt from the provisions of said  
28 Uniform Classification and Compensation Act. All persons occupying positions  
29 authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions of the Regular  
30 Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-101), or its  
31 successor.

6 SECTION 5. SPECIAL LANGUAGE - ALLOCATION RESTRICTION. Of the amounts  
7 allocated in Section 4 hereof, it is the intent of the General Assembly that  
8 such amounts are to be the maximum expended in the applicable fiscal year from  
9 the funds as appropriated in Section 3 hereof for the benefit of the  
10 appropriate program so enumerated. Provided, however, that in the event that  
11 unforeseen circumstances occur in either fiscal year that would necessitate a  
12 transfer of the maximum allocation provided in Section 4, hereof from one or  
13 more programs to another program or programs as enumerated in said Section 4,  
14 the Department shall make its request known, and the reasons thereof, to the  
15 Budget Division, Department of Finance and Administration, in such form and  
16 detail as may be required by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, and if  
17 approved, such transfer approval shall be transmitted to the Fiscal and Tax  
18 Research Division of the Bureau of Legislative Research, who shall make a  
19 report of the transfers and the reasons thereof to the Arkansas Legislative  
20 Council at least quarterly. Further provided, that nothing in this Section  
21 shall be construed in such a manner as to allow a transfer between any items  
22 as set out in Section 3 hereof, nor that any transfer request of allocations  
23 be granted unless needed, as determined by the Department of Finance and  
24 Administration, has been proven to the satisfaction of said Department of  
25 Finance and Administration.

9 granted to the Arkansas Entertainers Hall of Fame Board to the Department of

12 SECTION 36. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds  
13 authorized by this Act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency

16 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary

22 SECTION 37. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General  
23 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations  
24 contained in this Act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which  
25 this Act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive  
26 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget  
27 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or  
28 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative  
29 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

30

31 SECTION 38. CODE. All provisions of this Act of a general and  
32 permanent nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the  
33 Arkansas Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

34

35 SECTION 39. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this Act or the

1 application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such  
2 invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Act which  
3 can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this  
4 end the provisions of this Act are declared to be severable.

5

6 SECTION 40. GENERAL REPEALER. All laws and parts of laws in conflict  
7 with this Act are hereby repealed.

8

9 SECTION 41. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the  
10 Eighty-First General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas  
11 prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that  
12 the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 1997 is essential to the operation of  
13 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in  
14 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective  
15 date of this Act beyond July 1, 1997 could work irreparable harm upon the  
16 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.  
17 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being  
18 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and  
19 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 1997.
