- 7 (d) Students who are selected as Arkansas Governor Scholars who also
- 8 exhibit academic ability as defined in this subchapter shall be designated as
- 9 Arkansas Governors Distinguished Scholars.

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- 11 SECTION 4. Arkansas Code 6-82-308 is amended to read as follows:
- 12 \display=6-82-308. Number and geographic distribution of scholarships.
- 13 The number of scholarship awards to eligible high achievers shall not
- 14 exceed one hundred fifty (150) three hundred (300) each year. However, one (1)
- 15 such award shall be made to a student in each of the seventy-five (75)
- 16 counties, and the remainder shall be made to students from the state at
- 17 large.

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- 19 SECTION 5. Arkansas Code 6-82-311 (c), concerning renewal of
- 20 scholarships, is amended to read as follows:

All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature 5 6 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code 7 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code. 8 9 SECTION 8. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to 10 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect 11 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without 12 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this 13 act are declared to be severable. 14 15 SECTION 9.
