18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARK.	ANSAS:

20	SECTION 1. (a) A person in lawful possession of real property or		
21	tangible, movable property is justified in using physical force other than		
22	deadly physical force against another when and to the degree the actor		
23	reasonably believes the physical force is immediately necessary to prevent or		
24	terminate the others trespass on the land or unlawful interference with the		
25	property.		
26	(b) A person unlawfully dispossessed of real property or tangible,		
27	novable property by another is justified in using physical force other than		
28	deadly physical force against the other when and to the degree the actor		
29	easonably believes the physical force is immediately necessary to reenter the		
30	real property or recover the tangible, movable property if the actor uses the		
31	force immediately or in fresh pursuit after the dispossession and:		
32	(1) the actor reasonably believes the other had no claim of right		
33	when he dispossessed the actor; or		
34	(2) the other accomplished the dispossession by using physical		
35	force, threat, or fraud against the actor.

1 SECTION 2. A person is justified in using deadly physical force against 2 another to protect real property or tangible, movable property: 3 (1) if he would be justified in using physical force against the other under Section 1 of this act; and 5 (2) when and to the degree he reasonably believes the deadly physical force is immediately necessary to prevent the other's imminent commission of arson, residential or commercial burglary, robbery, aggravated robbery or theft during the nighttime; and 9 (3) he reasonably believes that the use of physical force other than deadly physical force to protect or recover the real property or tangible, 11 movable property would expose the actor or another to a substantial risk of 12 death or serious bodily injury. 13 14 SECTION 3. This act shall be supplemental to all laws regarding the 15 defense of justification as defined in Title 5, Chapter 2, Subchapter 6 of the 16 Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated. 17 SECTION 4. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature 18 19 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code 20 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code. 21 22 SECTION 5. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to 23 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect 24 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without 25 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this 26 act are declared to be severable. 27 2.8 SECTION 6. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are 29 hereby repealed. 30 31 32 33 34
