27	SECTION 1.	Purpose. (a) It is found and determined by	the General

Arkansas Code 6-43-101, concerning the Board of Trustees of the Arkansas School for the Blind and the Arkansas School for the Deaf, is '(j)(1) In addition to all other requirements of this section: 6 7 (A) One (1) member of the board shall be a person who is 8 legally blind; 9 (B) Appointments shall be made so that no more than two (2) members of the board shall reside in the same congressional district; and 11 (C) The racial make-up of the board should reflect the 12 racial population of the schools as accurately as possible. (2) The provisions of this subsection (j) shall apply to board 13 14 positions expiring after July 1, 1997. The parents and guardians of deaf students shall annually elect a 16 representative from their membership and the parents and quardians of blind 17 students shall annually elect a representative from their membership. The two 18 (2) representatives shall be entitled to attend and participate in all 19 meetings of the board and shall be afforded the same privileges as a member of 20 the board but shall not be entitled to vote. 21 SECTION 3. Arkansas Code 6-43-101, concerning the Board of Trustees of 2.2 23 the Arkansas School for the Blind and the Arkansas School for the Deaf, is 24 amended to read as follows: 25 $^{\emptyset}(exttt{g})$ The board of trustees shall meet at least monthly and shall fix a 2.6 regular date for the monthly meeting. Board meetings shall be held at 27 times convenient for the public to attend. The board should consider evening 28 or Saturday meetings. The board shall provide time during each meeting for the 29 public to address the board." 30 31 SECTION 4. Arkansas Code Title 6, Chapter 43, Subchapter 1 is amended 32 to add a new section to read as follows: $^{\emptyset}$ 6-43-115. Training and instruction - Reimbursement. 33 (a)(1) All members of the Board of Trustees of the Arkansas School for 34 35 the Blind and the Arkansas School for the Deaf should receive a minimum of six

36 (6) hours of training and instruction in the school laws of this state and in

the laws governing the powers, duties, and responsibilities of the board. 2 (2) The instruction shall be sponsored by the Department of Education in cooperation with the Board of Trustees of the Arkansas School for the Blind and the Arkansas School for the Deaf. All or a part of the instruction may be provided in conjunction with the instruction required for school board members under Arkansas Code 6-13-629. 7 (b) The Board of Trustees of the Arkansas School for the Blind and the Arkansas School for the Deaf is authorized to pay necessary expenses and to reimburse board members for expenses incurred in attending in-service workshops, conferences, and other courses of training and instruction 11 necessary to complete the training and instruction provided for by this 12 section. Expense reimbursement shall be made in accordance with 25-16-901 et 13 seq. 14 15 SECTION 5. EMERGENCY. It is found and determined by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that only one position on the Board of Trustees of the Arkansas School for the Blind and the Arkansas School for the 17 Deaf has any selection criteria for appointment; that in order to ensure that 18 the future board continues to adequately serve the two institutions under its 19 supervision, this act is immediately necessary to establish selection criteria for future appointees to the board; and that this act provides ways to increase public participation in meetings of the board that are immediately 22 necessary to maintain and enhance the reputation of the board with the general 2.3 public. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall become effective on the date of its approval by the Governor. If 27 the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall become effective on the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor 2.8 29 may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, it shall become effective on the date the last house overrides the 3.0 31 veto. 32 33 34 /s/Hopkins
