SPECIAL LANGUAGE - RESTRICTIONS. The funds appropriated by 5 Item (03) of Section 2 herein, shall be administered by the Department of Education - Vocational and Technical Education Division and shall be used to provide additional assistance to local school districts to enhance and/or upgrade equipment in existing job-specific programs. Pursuant to policies and regulations which include applications, disbursement procedures, and matching 11 requirements of the Vocational and Technical Division, these funds can be used 12 to purchase capital equipment to enhance or technically upgrade existing job-specific vocational programs. Such funds shall be distributed to local school districts in such amounts, as determined by the Department of Education 15 - Vocational and Technical Education Division. 16 17 SECTION 6. SPECIAL LANGUAGE - Of the funds appropriated and made available for Computer-Based Education Grants in Section 1 of this Act, an 19 amount up to \$100,000 per year may be used to contract with private providers for continuing an adult literacy project. 20 2.1 SECTION 7. The Director of the Department of Education, with the 22 23 approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer and after review by the Arkansas Legislative Council, is hereby authorized to request necessary appropriation transfers and any other budget related adjustments necessary to implement The 26 Equitable School Finance System Act of 1995. 27 SECTION 8. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. Beginning with the 1996-97 school year, 29 Local School Districts shall pay the teacher retirement employer contribution 30 rate for any eligible employee in accordance with rules and regulations established by the Teacher Retirement Board of Directors. The appropriation 32 contained herein for Teacher Retirement Matching each fiscal year shall be 33 used to provide the employer matching for employees of the Cooperative 34 Education Services Areas, Vocational Centers, Model Vocational Technical

35 Education Resource Center, and the school operated by the Department of

1 Correction. 2 SECTION 9. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. Beginning with the 1996-97 school year, 3 Local School Districts shall pay the health insurance contribution rate established by the State Board of Education for each eligible employee electing to participate in the Public School Employee Health Insurance Program. The appropriation contained herein for Public School Employee Insurance each fiscal year shall be used to provide the state contribution for insurance premiums for employees of the Cooperative Education Services Areas, Vocational Centers, Model Vocational Technical Education Resource Center, and the school operated by the Department of Correction. 11 12 SECTION 10. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. The appropriations contained herein for 13 14 Vocational Center Aid and Vocational Center Start-Up shall be allocated in 15 accordance with rules and regulations established by the State Board of 16 Vocational Education, after the rules and regulations have undergone a prior review by the Administrative Rules and Regulations Subcommittee of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee. 19 SECTION 11. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. Of the funds and appropriation 20 21 authorized by Item (01) in Section 2 of this Act for Adult Basic and General 22 Adult Education, a sum of \$1,050,000 each fiscal year shall be made available 23 to the secondary area vocational centers managed by local education agencies, in order to expand the vocational education and training opportunities available to area citizens in need of adult educational training or retraining 2.6 due to changing technology. 27 The secondary area vocational centers which elect to provide enhanced education/training employment or retraining services appropriate to area industry/business needs, may request from the State Board of Vocational Education to be designated as a Community Based Education Center. 30 31 32 SECTION 12. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. Of the funds and appropriation provided 33 for At-Risk, the Department of Education shall spend up to, but not exceed, 34 the sum of \$1,000,000 each fiscal year to monitor and assess or enter into a 35 Professional/Consultant Services contract for the purpose of monitoring and

- 1 assessing, the various programs under the purview of the Department of
- 2 Education. Further, the Department of Education shall report the findings of
- 3 such monitoring and assessment to the Joint Interim Committee on Education
- 4 each fiscal year.

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- 6 SECTION 13. (A) For the fiscal year ending June 30, 1998, the
- 7 Department of Education shall from time to time as needed, certify to the
- 8 State Treasurer and the Chief Fiscal Office of the State, the amount of funds
- 9 disbursed for desegregation expenses under the "Pulaski County School
- 10 Desegregation Settlement Agreement." Upon the receipt of such certification,
- 11 the State Treasurer, after making those deductions as set out in Arkansas Code
- 12 19-5-202(b)(2)(B), shall also deduct up to, but not to exceed in total for
- 13 fiscal year 1997-98 the sum of \$28,000,000 from the net general revenues and
- 14 transfer this amount to the Public School Fund.
- 15 (B) For the fiscal year ending June 30, 1999, the Department of Education
- 16 shall from time to time as needed, certify to the State Treasurer and the
- 17 Chief Fiscal Office of the State, the amount of funds disbursed for
- 18 desegregation expenses under the "Pulaski County School Desegregation
- 19 Settlement Agreement." Upon the receipt of such certification, the State
- 20 Treasurer, after making those deductions as set out in Arkansas Code 19-5-
- 21 202(b)(2)(B), shall also deduct up to, but not to exceed in total for fiscal
- 22 year 1998-99 the sum of \$28,100,000 from the net general revenues and transfer
- 23 this amount to the Public School Fund.

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- 25 SECTION 14. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. The appropriation contained herein for
- 26 Consolidation Incentive shall be allocated in accordance with rules and
- 27 regulations established by the State Board of Education.

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- 29 SECTION 15. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. The funds appropriated herein for
- 30 Residential Centers/Juvenile Detention shall be allocated in accordance with
- 31 rules and regulations established by the State Board of Education.

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- 33 SECTION 16. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. The State Board of Education shall have
- 34 the authority to budget carryover balances in the Public School Fund.
- 35 However, the State Board shall first budget any carryover balances to fund

1 appropriations designated as targeted categories in Item (33) of Section 1 of this Act, and Incentive Funding I and Additional Base Funding. 3 SECTION 17. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. The appropriation and funds authorized 4 herein for PURCHASE OF WORKERS' COMPENSATION COVERAGE BY SCHOOL DISTRICTS AND EDUCATION SERVICE COOPERATIVES shall be distributed proportionally by the Department of Education to each of the various school districts based on each school district's average daily membership (ADM) the previous year and to each of the state's education service cooperatives in an amount equal to 50% of the amount each cooperative expended for that purpose the previous year. 10 11 12 SECTION 18. SPECIAL LANGUAGE - ADULT EDUCATION CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS. In the event that there is an unexpended balance of monies remaining at the end of any fiscal year from the amount approved by the State Board of Education for Adult Education programs from the Public School Fund, 15 such amount shall be set aside and carried forward to be used exclusively for 17 financing Adult Education Capital Improvement Projects. 18 19 SECTION 19. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. The funds appropriated for Catastrophic Loss Funding in SECTION 1 of this Act shall first be made available to local 2.0 school districts that received fiscal crisis relief funding for loss of maintenance and operation revenues during the 1996-97 school year. 23 24 SECTION 20. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. The funds appropriated for Computer-25 Based Education Grants in Section 1 of this Act shall be distributed to IMPAC 26 Learning Systems, Inc., for the purpose of providing computer-based education 27 grants to public school districts and provide for the maintenance and operations support for these computer-based education systems. 2.8 29 30 SECTION 21. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. The funds appropriated for Computer-Based 31 Education Operations in Section 1 of this Act shall be distributed to IMPAC 32 Learning Systems, Inc., for the purpose of providing the maintenance and 33 operations support for preexisting computer-based education systems. 34 SECTION 22. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. Arkansas Code Annotated \$6-16-405 (4) is 35

1 hereby repealed: 2 '(4) Develop and implement standards and criteria for the evaluation and 3 recommendation to the Department of Education of computer-based educational 5 projects to be operated by the Department of Education and the public school districts of this State and for the allocation of funds and assistance by the commission to the department or public schools of this State for use in the support and operation of computer-based education projects in the public 9 schools.' 10 SECTION 23. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. Arkansas Code Annotated  $^66$ -16-406 is 11 12 hereby repealed: 13 ' (a) The Department of Education shall, after seeking the advice of the 14 15 commission, recommend to the State Board of Education proposed standards, 16 criteria, rules, and regulations for providing financial assistance to school 17 districts to be used in connection with computer-based education projects in 18 the public schools. These rules and regulations shall include forms and 19 instructions developed by the Department of Education, upon which school 20 districts may make application for financial assistance for computer-based 21 education projects. Before approving such standards, criteria, rules, and 22 regulations and forms, the State Board of Education shall hold hearings 23 thereon, and adopt them in the manner provided by the Arkansas Administrative 24 Procedure Act, as amended, A25-15-201 et seq. (b) The Department of Education shall provide leadership and assistance 2.5 26 to local school districts by training teachers in means of using computer 27 technology in the instructional process in teaching and improving of learning 28 opportunities in the basic skills in the public schools. (c) The Department of Education may acquire, develop, test, evaluate, 29 30 and improve computer software and computer-based instructional materials and, 31 after obtaining the assistance and advice of the commission, recommend to 32 school distrcts in this State computer software and instructional materials 33 deemed to meet the standards established for computer-based education projects 34 required to receive funds or to obtain matching funds to be made available by 35 the department or by the commission to assist in defraying the cost of

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1 computer-based education projects in the public schools.
        (d) The Department of Education may hold seminars and training sessions
   and offer technical advice and assistance to its own staff and school
   districts as may be deemed necessary in support and improvement of computer-
   based educational projects in the public schools of this State.'
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        SECTION 24. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. Arkansas Code Annotated 6-16-407 is
   hereby repealed.
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       ' (a) The Department of Education shall, in accordance with the
11 standards, rules, regulations, and forms promulgated and approved by the State
12 Board of Education, receive applications from school districts in this state
13 for computer-based educational projects. Upon receipt of such applications,
14 the Department of Education shall submit them to the commission for its
15 evaluation and recommendations.
        (b) The Commission shall review all applications for computer-based
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17 educational projects received by the Department of Education and filed with
18 the commission for its review, and after making such study, evaluation, and
19 investigation in connection therewith as the commission deems appropriate, it
20 shall, in writing, submit its evaluations, findings, and recommendations in
21 regard thereto to the Department of Education. In addition, the commission
22 shall notify the Department of Education of the amount of the funds or other
23 assistance which will be provided in support of any such project.
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        (c) After receiving the advice and recommendations of the commission, the
25 Department of Education shall review each application for financial assistance
26 for computer-based educational projects received from school districts and
27 shall notify the school district in writing of its approval or rejection of
28 such application, provided that the department may return the application to

30 be filed with the department before final action is taken on the application.
31 If the application is approved for state assistance, the department shall
32 notify the school district of the extent to which the department or the
33 commission will provide financial assistance to the project.
        (d) If the Department of Education shall determine that the amount of
35 funds available during any fiscal year for providing financial support of
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1 computer-based educational projects and support programs will not be adequate 2 to fund all such projects for which applications are filed by school districts 3 for state assistance, the department shall review all such applications and 4 shall approve those projects which the department believes to be in the best 5 interest of the needs of applying school districts that have the capability of 6 producing maximum educational results within the limitations of the funds 7 available. In arriving at such decision, the Department of Education shall seek the advice and evaluation of the commission with respect to applications 9 for computer-based educational projects. (e) The commission may delegate to the Director of General Education, the 10 11 Director of Vocational and Technical Education, or any designated official or 12 employee of the department, the authority to review applications for computer-13 based educational projects and to approve them in behalf of the commission as 14 being eligible for funds to be made availabled by the commission, in 15 accordance with the appropriate rules and regulations promulgated by the 16 commission. 17 SECTION 25. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. Arkansas code annotated  $^66$ -16-408 is 18 hereby repealed: '(a) The commission and the Deaprtment of Education shall, from time to 20 21 time, monitor the accomplishments and achievements of each computer-based 22 instructional project being operated in the public schools through financial 23 assistance provided by the department or the commission and may make 24 recommendations to the project. (b) The commission may recommend to the Department of Education the 2.5 26 termination and withdrawal of financial support to any computer-based 27 instructional project or may withdraw any financial or in-kind support that 28 the commission is making to such project, if the commission determines that 29 the project is not being operated in accordance with the criteria, standards, 30 rules, and regulations promulgated by the State Board of Education and by the 31 commission. 32 SECTION 26. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds 33 34 authorized by this Act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency 35 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and

- 1 the restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and
- 2 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
- 3 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control
- 4 laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the
- 5 Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
- 6 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

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- 8 SECTION 27. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
- 9 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
- 10 contained in this Act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which
- 11 this Act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
- 12 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
- 13 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
- 14 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
- 15 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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- 17 SECTION 28. CODE. All provisions of this Act of a general and
- 18 permanent nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the
- 19 Arkansas Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

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- 21 SECTION 29. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this Act or the
- 22 application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such
- 23 invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Act which
- 24 can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this
- 25 end the provisions of this Act are declared to be severable.

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- 27 SECTION 30. GENERAL REPEALER. All laws and parts of laws in conflict
- 28 with this Act are hereby repealed.

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- 30 SECTION 31. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the
- 31 Eighty-First General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas
- 32 prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that
- 33 the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 1997 is essential to the operation of
- 34 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
- 35 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective

1	date of this Act beyond July 1, 1997 could work irreparable harm upon the
2	proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
3	Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
4	necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
5	safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 1997.
