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18	WHEREAS, the United Nations has designated 67 sites in the United States
19	as "World Heritage Sites" or "Biosphere Reserves", which altogether are about
20	equal in size to the State of Colorado, the eighth largest state; and
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22	WHEREAS, Article IV, Section 3 of the United States Constitution
23	provides that the United States Congress shall make all needed rules and
24	regulations governing lands belonging to the United States; and
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26	WHEREAS, many of the United Nations designations include private
27	property inholdings and contemplate "buffer zones" of adjacent land; and
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29	WHEREAS, some international land designations such as those under the
30	United States Biosphere Reserve Program and the Man and Biosphere Program of
31	the United Nations Scientific, Educational, and Cultural Organization, operate
32	under independent national committees, such as the United States National Man
33	and Biosphere Committee, which have no legislative directives or authorization
34	from Congress; and
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36	WHEREAS, these international designations, as presently handled are an

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1 open invitation to the international community to interfere in domestic land 2 use decisions; and WHEREAS, the local citizens and public officials usually have no say in 5 the designation of land near their homes for inclusion in an international 6 land use program; and WHEREAS, the President and Executive Branch of the United States have, 9 by Executive Order and other agreements, implemented these designations 10 without approval by the Congress; and 11 12 WHEREAS, actions by the President in applying international agreements 13 to lands owned by the United States may circumvent Congress; and 14 WHEREAS, Congressman Don Young has introduced a bill in the 104th 15 16 Congress entitled the "American Land Sovereignty Protection Act of 1996", 17 which required the explicit approval of Congress prior to restricting any use 18 of United States lands under international agreements. 19 20 NOW THEREFORE, 21 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE EIGHTY-FIRST GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE 22 OF ARKANSAS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN: 23 24 THAT the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas reaffirms the 25 Constitutional Authority of Congress as the elected representatives of the 26 people, and urges the introduction and passage of the "American Land 27 Sovereignty Protection Act" by both the House of Representatives and the 28 Senate as soon as possible during the 105th Congress. 29 30 31 32 33 34 35
