8	SUPPORTING CONTINUED FEDERAL FUNDING OF THE ARKANSAS

12	SUPPORTING CONTINUED FEDERAL FUNDING OF
13	THE ARKANSAS NATIONAL GUARD YOUTH CORPS
14	CHALLENGE PROGRAM

16	WHEREAS, the Arkansas National Guard Youth Corps Challenge Program has
17	provided 569 sixteen to eighteen year old graduates of the program with
18	critically needed academic, vocational, and life skills education and
19	training; and
20	WHEREAS, the Challenge Program, through its military discipline and
21	structure, has installed in its graduates self-confidence, self-esteem, and
22	good citizenship skills; and
23	WHEREAS, the Challenge Program provides $Arkansass$ at-risk youth (high
24	school dropouts) with an opportunity to become successful, productive citizens
25	of the state and the nation; and
26	WHEREAS, the Challenge Program is an important, cost-effective crime and
27	poverty prevention program worthy of continued support by the government of
28	the United States; and
29	WHEREAS, 85% of the graduates of the Challenge Program are either
30	employed, in school, or in higher education; and
31	WHEREAS, of the 569 graduates of the Arkansas National Guard Youth
32	Challenge Program only three young people (one-half of one percent) have
33	entered the criminal justice system; and
34	WHEREAS, of all high school dropouts, 80% to 85% will enter the criminal
35	justice system (in 1995, 7,620 students dropped out of grades seven through
36	twelve); and

1 WHEREAS, the cost of Youth Challenge preventing one high school dropout 2 from entering the criminal justice system is approximately twelve thousand 3 dollars (\$12,000) per student, including food shelter, clothing, and medical 4 care); and

5 WHEREAS, the cost of incarceration is in excess of thirty-two thousand 6 dollars (\$32,000) per year; and

7 WHEREAS, the average Youth Challenge student who returns to the public
8 school system has improved his or her overall academic performance and
9 increased 2.2 academic years over his or her dropout status; and

10 WHEREAS, Youth Challenge has the highest GED pass rate for at-risk youth 11 of any program in the state; and

12 WHEREAS, federal funding for the Challenge Program is scheduled to end 13 in September 1998.

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15 NOW THEREFORE,

16 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE EIGHTY-FIRST GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE 17 OF ARKANSAS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:

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19 THAT the Arkansas General Assembly supports continued federal funding 20 for the Arkansas National Guard Youth Corps Challenge Program.

21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Arkansas General Assembly urges the 22 United States Congress to continue funding for the Arkansas National Guard 23 Youth Corps Challenge Program and urges the President of the United States to 24 support the funding.

25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT copies of this resolution shall be sent to 26 the Honorable Bill Clinton, President of the United States; the Honorable Al 27 Gore, Jr., Vice-President of the United States and President of the United 28 States Senate; the Honorable Strom Thurmond, President Pro Tempore of the 29 United States Senate; the Honorable Newt Gingrich, Speaker of the United 30 States House of Representatives; the Honorable Dale Bumpers and the Honorable 31 Tim Hutchinson, United States Senators; and the Honorable Jay Dickey, the 32 Honorable Vic Snyder, the Honorable Marion Berry, and the Honorable Asa 33 Hutchinson, United States Representatives, members of the Arkansas delegation 34 in Congress.

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
