8	REQUESTING THE SENATE INTERIM COMMITTEE ON INSURANCE AND
9	COMMERCE AND THE HOUSE INTERIM COMMITTEE ON INSURANCE AND
10	COMMERCE TO CONDUCT A STUDY OF THE IMPACT OF COMPETITION
11	IN THE ELECTRIC UTILITY INDUSTRY ON THE CITIZENS OF
12	ARKANSAS, THE ELECTRIC UTILITY INDUSTRY AND THE REGULATORY
13	AUTHORITY OF THE ARKANSAS PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION.

16	REQUESTING THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE
17	INTERIM COMMITTEE ON INSURANCE AND
18	COMMERCE TO CONDUCT A STUDY OF THE
19	IMPACT OF COMPETITION IN THE ELECTRIC
20	UTILITY INDUSTRY ON THE CITIZENS OF
21	ARKANSAS, THE ELECTRIC UTILITY INDUSTRY
22	AND THE REGULATORY AUTHORITY OF THE
23	ARKANSAS PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION.

26	WHEREAS, many state legislators and regulatory authorities are assessing
27	whether a competitive retail generation market and the choice of generation
28	suppliers to consumers can achieve economic benefits beyond the current
29	regulated structure; and
30	WHEREAS, certain legislation is pending in the Congress of the United
31	States that would, inter alia, require states to allow retail competition in
32	the electric utility industry at some time in the future; and
33	WHEREAS, the citizens of Arkansas are entitled to continue to enjoy the
34	high level of reliability and universally available service that currently is
35	delivered by the regulated electric industry; and
36	WHEREAS, any changes in the electric utility industry structure should

- 1 provide benefits to all current utility customers and not simply shift costs
- 2 from one class of customers to another class of customers or to utility
- 3 stockholders; and
- 4 WHEREAS, a transition to a competitive retail generation market must be
- 5 made in an orderly fashion to ensure that service reliability and economic
- 6 efficiency for customers is maintained; and
- 7 WHEREAS, any changes in the current electric industry structure must
- 8 respect past regulatory commitments to all stakeholders; and
- 9 WHEREAS, the transition to any competitive electric market will require
- 10 time and resources to achieve benefits for all stakeholders; and
- 11 WHEREAS, any new competitive electric market must be fair to all
- 12 suppliers and not hinder one supplier with obligations not shared by its
- 13 competitors; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Entergy Arkansas, Inc. has filed an application with the
- 15 Arkansas Public Service Commission requesting approval of certain rate
- 16 proposals in Docket No. 96-360-U designed to facilitate a transition to
- 17 competition; and
- 18 WHEREAS, other state regulators are considering similar proposals by
- 19 individual utilities in their states; and
- 20 WHEREAS, it is not the intent of the General Assembly in adopting this
- 21 resolution to cause a delay in the consideration and disposition by the APSC
- 22 of the proposals contained in APSC Docket No. 96-360-U.

- 24 NOW THEREFORE,
- 25 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE EIGHTY-FIRST GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE
- 26 OF ARKANSAS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:

- 28 THAT the Senate Interim Committee on Insurance and Commerce and the
- 29 House Interim Committee on Insurance and Commerce conduct a study, to begin on
- 30 or after the Arkansas Public Service Commissions final order in Docket No.
- 31 96-360-U or by December 1, 1997, whichever comes first, with the cooperation
- 32 of all agencies in the executive branch, to determine what statutory actions
- 33 may be necessary and advisable to allow the citizens of Arkansas to have
- 34 access to a competitive system of electric service; and the appropriate
- 35 timetable for a transition to such a system.
