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1	SECTION 4. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are		
2	hereby repealed.		
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4	SECTION 5. <u>EMERGENCY CLAUSE</u> . It is hereby found and determined by the		
5	Eighty-second General Assembly that the area of advanced communications and		
6	information technology is a rapidly growing and changing area of education;		
7	that the facilitation of policy development for advanced communications and		
8	information technology is necessary for the advancement of interest of the		
9	state; that the effectiveness of this Act is essential to the operation of the		
10	Joint Committee on Advanced Communications and Information Technology, and		
11	that a delay in the effective date could work irreparable harm upon the proper		
12	administration and provisions of an essential governmental committee.		
13	Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately		
14	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall		
15	become effective on the date of its approval by the Governor. If the bill is		
16	neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall become effective on the		
17	expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill.		
18	If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, it shall		
19	become effective on the date the last house overrides the veto.		
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
