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9 "AN ACT TO ALLOW THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE TO SELECT
10 SEVEN (7) HOUSE MEMBERS TO SERVE ON THE JOINT
11 COMMITTEE ON ADVANCED COMMUNICATIONS AND INFORMATION
12 TECHNOLOGY FROM THE HOUSE AT LARGE; AND FOR OTHER
13 PURPOSES."

Subtitle

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16 "AN ACT TO AMEND ARKANSAS CODE 10-3-1703."
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18 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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20 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code 10-3-1703(B)(i) pertaining to the membership
21 of the Joint Committee on Advanced Communications and Information Technology
22 is amended to read as follows:

23 "(B)(i) Seven (7) members of the House of Representatives to be
24 selected by the Speaker of the House of Representatives ~~from the membership of~~
25 ~~the Joint Energy Committee.~~"

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27 SECTION 2. All provisions of this Act of a general and permanent nature
28 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code
29 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.
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31 SECTION 3. If any provision of this Act or the application thereof to
32 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect
33 other provisions or applications of the Act which can be given effect without
34 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
35 Act are declared to be severable.

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1 SECTION 4. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are
 2 hereby repealed.

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 4 SECTION 5. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the
 5 Eighty-second General Assembly that the area of advanced communications and
 6 information technology is a rapidly growing and changing area of education;
 7 that the facilitation of policy development for advanced communications and
 8 information technology is necessary for the advancement of interest of the
 9 state; that the effectiveness of this Act is essential to the operation of the
 10 Joint Committee on Advanced Communications and Information Technology, and
 11 that a delay in the effective date could work irreparable harm upon the proper
 12 administration and provisions of an essential governmental committee.
 13 Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately
 14 necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall
 15 become effective on the date of its approval by the Governor. If the bill is
 16 neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall become effective on the
 17 expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill.
 18 If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, it shall
 19 become effective on the date the last house overrides the veto.

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
