28 29	(b) The permissible fireworks consist of those defined in Interstate Commerce Commission regulations described as Class C fireworks only and shall

The inside tube diameter shall not 8 9 exceed one-half inch (1/2"); (4) Cylindrical fountains, total pyrotechnic composition not to 10 11 exceed seventy-five (75) grams each in weight. The inside tube diameter shall 12 not exceed three-fourths inch (3/4"); (5) Cone fountains, total pyrotechnic composition not to exceed 13 fifty (50) grams each in weight; 14 (6) Wheels, total pyrotechnic composition not to exceed sixty 15 16 (60) grams for each driver unit or two hundred forty (240) grams for each complete wheel. The inside tube diameter of driver units shall not exceed one-17 18 half inch (1/2"); 19 (7) Illuminating torches and colored fire in any form, except 20 items included in subdivision (a)(12) of this section, total pyrotechnic 21 composition not to exceed one hundred (100) grams in weight; 22 (8) Sparklers and dipped sticks, total pyrotechnic composition not to exceed one hundred (100) grams each in weight. Pyrotechnic composition 23 24 containing any chlorate or perchlorate shall not exceed five (5) grams; 25 (9) Mines and shells of which the mortar is an integral part, 26 total pyrotechnic composition not to exceed forty (40) grams each in weight; 27 (10) Firecrackers and salutes with casings, the external 28 dimensions of which do not exceed one and one-half inches (1 1/2") in length 29 or one-quarter inch (1/4") in diameter, and other items designed to produce an audible effect, total pyrotechnic composition not to exceed two (2) grams each 30 31 in weight; (11) Novelties consisting of two (2) or more devices enumerated 32 in this paragraph, trick matches, and cigarette plugs, when approved by the 33 34 Federal Bureau of Explosives; (12) Railway fusees, truck flares, hand ship distress signals, 35 smoke signals, and smoke pots. 36

1 No component of any device listed in this section which is (b) (c) 2 designed to produce an audible effect shall contain pyrotechnic composition in 3 excess of two (2) grams in weight excluding propelling or expelling charges. (d) On and after September 1, 1999, the possession, sale, and use of 4 5 the common fireworks devices customarily known as 'bottle rockets', and as described herein, shall be unlawful within the State of Arkansas. Provided, 6 7 however, the possession or sale of bottle rockets by a manufacturer, importer, distributor, or jobber wholesaler to a person outside the State of Arkansas 8 9 for the purpose of resale outside the state shall not be considered as possession or sale occurring within the State of Arkansas. The prohibition 10 contained within this subsection shall not apply to the possession, sale, and 11 12 use of 'bottle rockets' with sticks, within Greene County, Arkansas and other 13 Arkansas counties which are adjacent to the Mississippi River. Any person violating the provisions of this subsection shall be guilty of a Class C 14 15 misdemeanor." 16 17 SECTION 2. All provisions of this Act of a general and permanent nature 18 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code 19 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code. 20 If any provision of this Act or the application thereof to 21 SECTION 3. 22 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Act which can be given effect without 23 24 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are declared to be severable. 25 26 27 SECTION 4.
