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12	SECTION 5. <u>EMERGENCY CLAUSE</u> . It is hereby found and determined by the		
13	Eighty-second General Assembly that unless the accounting needs of the		
14	Arkansas State Highway Employees' Retirement System are immediately automated		
15	delays could occur in preparing accurate financial statements and delays could		
16	occur in the recording of investment transactions, which statements and		
17	recordings are required to be maintained by State and federal laws and		
18	regulations; that such delays could work irreparable harm upon the proper		
19	administration of essential governmental programs; and in order to avoid these		
20	delays, this act should take effect immediately upon its passage and approval		
21	Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately		
22	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall		
23	become effective on the date of its approval by the Governor. If the bill is		
24	neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall become effective on the		
25	expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill.

27	become effective on the date the last house overrides the veto.		
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
