" 19 Subtitle 20 "TO REPEAL A.C.A. § 6-16-703 PERTAINING 21 22 TO MANDATORY SUMMER SCHOOL FOR STUDENTS IN KINDERGARTEN THROUGH GRADE 3." 23 24 25 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS: 26 27 28 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Annotated § 6-16-703 is repealed. 29 § 6-16-703. Legislative findings - Mandatory summer school - Rules and regulations - Funding programs. 30 (a)(1) The General Assembly hereby finds and acknowledges that if 31 remediation is necessary, it should be provided when students are younger and 32 before patterns of failure are established. The General Assembly further 33 acknowledges that the expansion of summer remedial instruction programs during 34 the summers of 1995 and 1996 did not generally prove to be as educationally 35 advantageous and as cost effective as anticipated, that the people of Arkansas 36

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would be better served if the state acted to ensure that all public school 1 2 students were able to read at or above grade level upon exiting grade three 3 (3), that local school districts are in the best position to determine if remediation is necessary for students in grades four (4) and five (5), and 4 that the districts should have the option of providing summer school for such 5 students and requiring attendance thereto to be eligible for promotion to the 6 7 next grade. (2) The General Assembly further finds that not all students are 8 financially able to pay for summer school, nor do all school districts hold 9 summer school. It is therefore the purpose of this section to allow the public 10 11 school districts of Arkansas to either individually or cooperatively provide 12 free summer school and summer school transportation to those students in kindergarten through grade three (K-3) who did not perform at grade level 13 during the regular school year and to ensure that students in kindergarten 14 through grade three (K-3) who are identified as in danger of not being able to 15 read at grade level by the end of the school year receive intensive reading 16 17 instruction during their regularly scheduled reading time throughout the 18 regular school year. 19 (3) It is further the purpose of this section to allow the public school districts of Arkansas to either individually or cooperatively provide 20 free summer school and summer school transportation to students in grades four 21 22 (4) and five (5) who did not perform at grade level during the regular school 23 year. (b)(1) Each student in kindergarten through grade three (K-3) who did 24 25 not perform at grade level during the regular school year shall attend summer school to be eligible for promotion to the next grade. 26 27 (2) Students in kindergarten through grade three (K-3) who are identified by the classroom teacher as in danger of not being able to read at 28 grade Level by the end of the school year should receive intensive reading 29 instruction during their regularly scheduled reading time throughout the 30 31 regular school year. (3) Any local school district may, at the option of its board of 32 directors, require a student in grade four (4) or five (5) who did not perform 33 at grade level to attend summer school to be eligible for promotion to the 34 next grade. 35 (c) The State Board of Education is hereby authorized to promulgate 36

2	(d) The State Board of Education is authorized to fund, from any funds
3	available for such purposes, the programs required by this section for
4	students in kindergarten through grade three (K-3) and any programs required

9	(3) Additional certified personnel to provide intensive

13	(e) Any local school district may apply to the Director of the
14	Department of Education for a waiver for use of in-school and summer school
15	remediation funds.
16	(f) The savings from not providing free summer school and summer school
17	transportation to students in grades four (4) and five (5) who did not perform
18	at grade level during the regular school year should be expended in the
19	intensive reading instruction program provided throughout the school year to
20	students in kindergarten through grade three (K-3) who are identified by the
21	classroom teacher as in danger of not being able to read at grade level by the
22	end of the school year.
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24	SECTION 2. Students in kindergarten through grade three (K-3) not
25	performing at grade level during the regular school year shall participate in
26	a Department of Education approved remediation program or a summer school
27	remediation program to be eligible for promotion to the next grade. Those
28	schools electing to not offer a summer school program shall offer a Department
29	of Education approved remediation program during the regular school year to
30	students in kindergarten through grade three (K-3) not performing at grade
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33	SECTION 3. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature
34	are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code
35	Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

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1	SECTION 4. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to
2	any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect
3	other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without
4	the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
5	act are declared to be severable.
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7	SECTION 5. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are
8	hereby repealed.
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10	SECTION 6. EMERGENCY. It is found and determined by the Eighty Second
11	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the effective operation of
12	Arkansas public schools is dependent upon immediate clarification of whether
13	school districts will be required to hold summer school in the summer of 1999
14	and that failure to implement this act immediately will result in confusion
15	and cause undue hardships to local school districts. Therefore, an emergency
16	is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the
17	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective or
18	the date of its approval by the Governor. If the bill is neither approved nor
19	vetoed by the Governor, it shall become effective on the expiration of the
20	period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill. If the bill is
21	vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, it shall become effective
22	on the date the last house overrides the veto.
