8	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code 6-16-403 through 6-16-408 are repealed.
9	6-16-403. Commission - Members.
10	(a) The commission shall consist of seven (7) voting members to be
11	appointed for terms of five (5) years and two (2) nonvoting members as
12	follows:
13	(1) The seven (7) voting members of the commission shall consist
14	of:
15	(A) The Director of General Education, who shall be an ex
16	officio member of the commission and shall serve as chairman;
17	(B) The Director of the Vocational and Technical Education
18	Division of the Department of Education, who shall be an ex officio member;
19	and
20	(C) Five (5) additional voting members of the commission to
21	be appointed by the Governor, subject to confirmation of the Senate; and
22	(2)(A) Two (2) nonvoting members shall be appointed by the
23	Governor from each General Assembly, one (1) of whom shall be a member of the
24	House of Representatives and one (1) of whom shall be a member of the Senate.
25	(B) The legislative nonvoting members of the commission

7	6-16-404. Commission - Meetings.
8	The commission shall meet at least once during each calendar quarter and
9	at such other times upon call by the chairman or as may be requested, in
10	writing, by any two (2) members of the commission.
11	6-16-405. Commission - Powers and duties.
12	The commission shall have the following powers, functions, and duties:
13	(1) Cooperate with and offer leadership, advice, and assistance to the
14	State Board of Education, the Department of Education, and the public schools
15	of this state with respect to computer technology and the uses by which
16	computer technology may aid and assist in the instruction process in teaching
17	basic skills in the public schools of this state;
18	(2) Encourage private firms, corporations, and individuals to provide

1	6-16-406. Department of Education - Powers and duties.
2	(a) The Department of Education shall, after seeking the advice of the
3	commission, recommend to the State Board of Education proposed standards,
4	criteria, rules, and regulations for providing financial assistance to school
5	districts to be used in connection with computer-based education projects in
6	the public schools. These rules and regulations shall include forms and
7	instructions developed by the Department of Education, upon which school
8	districts may make application for financial assistance for computer-based
9	education projects. Before approving such standards, criteria, rules, and
10	regulations and forms, the State Board of Education shall hold hearings
11	thereon, and adopt them in the manner provided by the Arkansas Administrative
12	Procedure Act, as amended, § 25-15-201 et seq.
13	(b) The Department of Education shall provide leadership and assistance
14	to local school districts by training teachers in means of using computer
15	technology in the instructional process in teaching and improving of learning
16	opportunities in the basic skills in the public schools.
17	(c) The Department of Education may acquire, develop, test, evaluate,
18	and improve computer software and computer-based instructional materials and,
19	after obtaining the assistance and advice of the commission, recommend to
20	school districts in this state computer software and instructional materials
21	deemed to meet the standards established for computer-based education projects
22	required to receive funds or to obtain matching funds to be made available by
23	the department or by the commission to assist in defraying the cost of
24	computer-based education projects in the public schools.
25	(d) The Department of Education may hold seminars and training sessions
26	and offer technical advice and assistance to its own staff and school
27	districts as may be deemed necessary in support and improvement of computer-
28	based educational projects in the public schools of this state.
29	6-16-407. Applications for computer-based educational projects.
30	(a) The Department of Education shall, in accordance with the
31	standards, rules, regulations, and forms promulgated and approved by the State
32	Board of Education, receive applications from school districts in this state
33	for computer-based educational projects. Upon receipt of such applications,
34	the Department of Education shall submit them to the commission for its
35	evaluation and recommendations.
36	(b) The commission shall review all applications for computer-based

educational projects received by the Department of Education and filed with 1 2 the commission for its review, and after making such study, evaluation, and 3 investigation in connection therewith as the commission deems appropriate, it shall, in writing, submit its evaluations, findings, and recommendations in 4 regard thereto to the Department of Education. In addition, the commission 5 shall notify the Department of Education of the amount of the funds or other 6 7 assistance which will be provided in support of any such project. (c) After receiving the advice and recommendations of the commission, 8 9 the Department of Education shall review each application for financial assistance for computer-based educational projects received from school 10 11 districts and shall notify the school district in writing of its approval or 12 rejection of such application, provided that the department may return the application to the school district and request that additional information or 13 supporting data be filed with the department before final action is taken on 14 the application. If the application is approved for state assistance, the 15 department shall notify the school district of the extent to which the 16 17 department or the commission will provide financial assistance to the project. (d) If the Department of Education shall determine that the amount of 18 19 funds available during any fiscal year for providing financial support of 20 computer-based educational projects and support programs will not be adequate to fund all such projects for which applications are filed by school districts 21 22 for state assistance, the department shall review all such applications and 23 shall approve those projects which the department believes to be in the best interest of the needs of applying school districts that have the capability of 24 producing maximum educational results within the limitations of the funds 25 26 available. In arriving at such decision, the Department of Education shall 27 seek the advice and evaluation of the commission with respect to applications 28 for computer-based educational projects. 29 (e) The commission may delegate to the Director of General Education, 30 the Director of Vocational and Technical Education, or any designated official or employee of the department, the authority to review applications for 31 computer-based educational projects and to approve them in behalf of the 32 33 commission as being eligible for funds to be made available by the commission, in accordance with the appropriate rules and regulations promulgated by the 34 35 commission. 36 6-16-408. Monitoring projects.

1	(a) The commission and the Department of Education shall, from time to
2	time, monitor the accomplishments and achievements of each computer-based
3	instructional project being operated in the public schools through financial
4	assistance provided by the department or the commission and may make
5	recommendations to the project.
6	(b) The commission may recommend to the Department of Education the
7	termination and withdrawal of financial support to any computer-based
8	instructional project or may withdraw any financial or in-kind support that
9	the commission is making to such project, if the commission determines that
10	the project is not being operated in accordance with the criteria, standards,
11	rules, and regulations promulgated by the State Board of Education and by the
12	commission.

14	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code 6-13-1024 is repealed.
15	6-13-1024. Cooperative Education Services Coordinating Council.
16	There is hereby created a council, to be known as the Cooperative
17	Education Services Coordinating Council. The Cooperative Education Services
18	Coordinating Council shall not be considered a state agency, board or
19	commission. Members of the council shall consist of the directors of the
20	various education service cooperatives. Members of the council shall not be
21	entitled to compensation or reimbursement for mileage or other per diem
22	expenses incurred in performance of their duties from moneys specifically
23	appropriated by law to the Cooperative Education Services Coordinating
24	Council. The membership of the council shall elect by a majority vote, a
25	chairman, vice chairman and secretary/treasurer and shall adopt by a majority
26	vote of the membership any and all necessary rules and regulations regarding
27	the duties, responsibilities, and operations of the council.
28	The primary responsibilities of the council are to act as a coordinating
29	body for the development and implementation of programs and activities for the
30	benefit of the education service cooperatives statewide and as such shall be
31	eligible to receive stipend funds from state and federal governments, school
32	districts and other public or private sources. Council duties and
33	responsibilities may include coordinating the purchase of commonly needed
34	supplies, materials and equipment in order to reduce the cost of such items to
35	the individual cooperatives. In addition, the council shall assist in the
36	development and implementation of establishing a distance learning classroom

in each of the educational cooperatives and including the one to be located in Pulaski County. SECTION 4. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code. SECTION 5. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this act are declared to be severable. SECTION 6. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are hereby repealed.
